## Goodland swimmers place fourth at Oakley

The Goodland Swim Team was at Oakley on Saturday and placed fourth with 193 points. Swimmers took home seven individual and five relay gold medals.

The Colby Swim Club was first with 290 points, Wray Swim Club second with 215 and Oberlin was third with 199 points.

The swimmers will compete Saturday in Burlington and be at home in Goodland on Saturday, July 2.

Dusty Johnson set his second backstroke record of the season. Swimming in the 11-12 boys, he won 100-yard freestyle (1:11.87), 50-yard backstroke (36.43) and 50-yard breaststroke (42.57). He set a new pool record in the 50-yard

Taryn Bedore (15-18 girls) won the 50-yard freestyle (27.74) and 100-yard butterfly (1:10.76) and place second in the 100-yard freestyle

Ian Bonsall (15-18 boys) was a winner in the 50-yard freestyle (25.27) and 100-yard backstroke (1:17.81) and placed second in the 100-yard freestyle (58.44).




