Atwood Lake race July 4

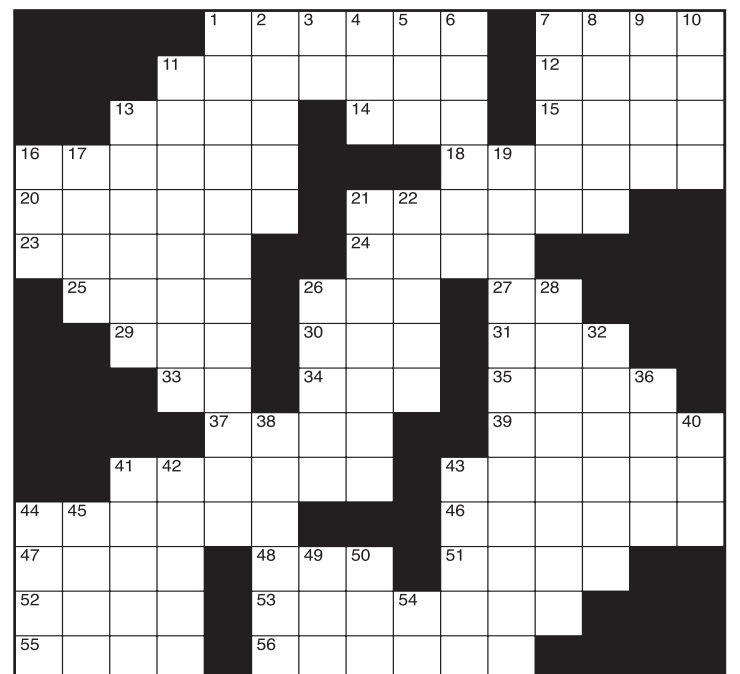
The 31st running of the Lake Atwood County Challenge Race at Atwood will be at 6:30 a.m. (Mountain Time) on Monday, July 4.
