Avila was the starting pitcher. Amthor came in for the third inning and Teeter pitched the fourth

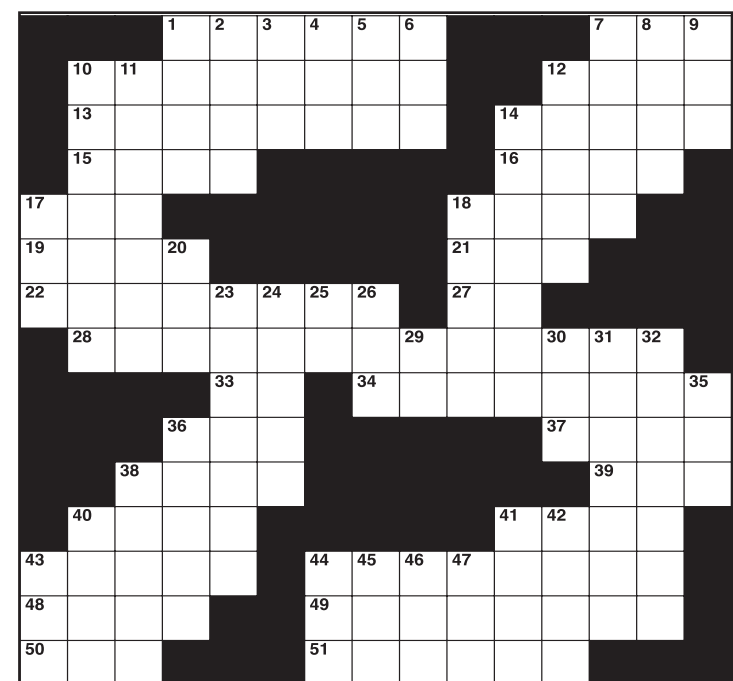
Nolan Deeds and Brevin Bergsma each had a single in the first inning. Bergsma, Riley Lopez and Avila scored runs.
