With passages of the resolution Sherman County will join the growing number of counties who have
agreed to the Rural Opportunity agreed to the R

At the city commission meeting Alomon said the Rural Opportunity Zone program is another tool busi nesses can use when recruiting a nesses can use when recruiting
college graduate to Goodland.

Mayor John Garcia asked Solo-
mon at the city meeting if a number
of counties have gotten on board with the program.
Solomon saidquite a few countis have opted in including Greeley, Wallace and Norton in this area.
He said Norton has agreed to put in $\$ 26,000$ next year, and is hoping for more if other area counties do not opt in.
He told the county commissioners money would only be expended when an applicant had lived in the
ounty for a year.
