

Slammers champions at Dodge City 'Super C'

The Goodland Slammers 16 and under team went 5-0 Saturday and Sunday to win the Dodge City Super C tournament over the weekend.

Coach Andy Scheopner said it was a good tournament for the girls who won the 14 and under division last year and this year moved up and won the combined 16 and 18 and under division.

He said at Dodge City they combined the 16 and under and the 18 and under teams for a 10-team field. Teams in the tournament included Goodland (16), Inman (16), Kansas Heat (16), Great Bend Quicksilver (16), Hays Edge (18), Oklahoma Pride (18), Garden City Rebels (18), Augusta Thunder (16), Dodge City (18) and Southern Colorado (Lamar, Colo., 18).

Saturday the Slammers won their two pool play games 4-0 over Inman and 6-0 over Kansas Heat.

Sunday Goodland started bracket play with a bye. The Slammers defeated Oklahoma Pride 4-2 in the second round. In the semi-finals Goodland defeated Southern Colorado 5-2.

In the championship game the Slammers defeated Hays Edge 4-1 to go 5-0 and win the tournament.

In the championship game all the scoring was in the first inning with Hope Cochran doubling and scored on a single by Stephanie DeLaRosa. DeLaRosa scored on a single by Brianna White. Gabby Rangel got hit by a pitch, and she and Brianna scored on passed balls.

DeLaRosa was the winning pitcher going five innings giving up 1 run on five hits. She struck out 3 and did not give up a walk.

In the game Berkley White and Miranda Hernandez had singles and Megan Siruta had a double.

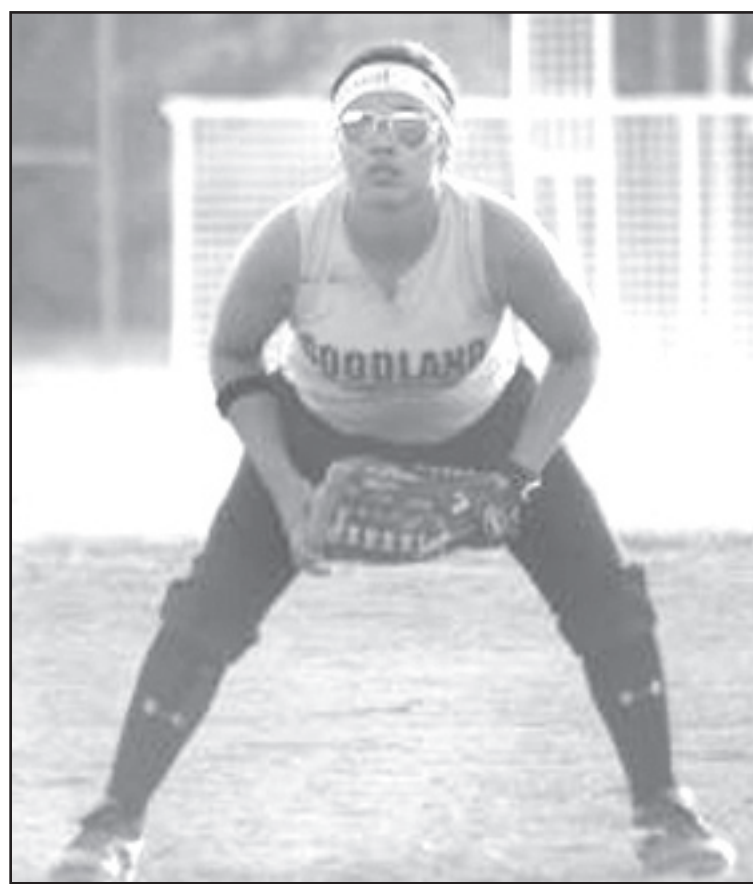


In the semi-final game against Southern Colorado the Slammers fell behind 1-0 in the first inning, but outscored the Lamar team 5-1 in the second inning to win 5-2.

In the second Siruta singled, Paige Phillips singled, Kaitlynn Raile walked. Siruta and Phillips scored on a single by Hernandez. Kyndell King walked to fill the

bases. Cochran walked to score Raile. DeLaRosa walked to score Hernandez, and Brianna White walked to score King.

Cochran was the winning pitcher going 4 innings giving up 4 hits, 2 runs. She had 3 strikeouts and gave up 4 walks. DeLaRosa came in to pitch the fifth inning giving up 0 hits, 0 runs and had 1 strikeout.

In the game Cochran, DeLaRosa, Berkley White, Sirtua and Hernandez had singles and Phillips had two singles.

Goodland faced Oklahoma Pride in the second round of bracket play on Sunday winning a tight 4-2 game in seven innings.

The Slammers took a 2-0 lead in the first and kept that until the Pride scored in the third to make it 2-1. Goodland added a run in the fourth

to make it 3-1, and added a run in the sixth to lead 4-1. The Pride scored a run in the bottom of the seventh to make the score 4-2 and give Goodland the win.

In pool play on Saturday the Slammers defeated Kansas Heat 6-0. Goodland took a 2-0 lead in the first, added two runs in the third, a run in the fourth and a run in the bottom of the sixth.

Cochran singled in the first, Berk-

ley White doubled and both runners scored on a single by Brianna White. In the third Cochran got her second single, DeLaRosa singled and both scored on a triple by Berkley White. Raile scored in the fourth inning, and in the sixth Brianna White singled and scored on a single by Siruta.

DeLaRosa was the winning pitcher going 7 innings and giving up 2 runs on 7 hits. She had 4 strikeouts and 0 walks.

Cochran had three singles; DeLaRosa, Berkley White, Brianna White, Siruta, Phillips, Raile and Hernandez had singles; Rangel had a single and a double; and King had a double.

In the opening game against Inman the Slammers won 4-0. Goodland took a 2-0 lead in the second inning and added two runs in the fifth inning.

In the second inning Rangel was hit by a pitch. Phillips hit into a fielders choice. Raile singled. Hernandez doubled to score both Rangel and Raile.

In the fifth inning Cochran hit a home run over the left field fence. Berkley White doubled and scored on a single by Rangel to make it 4-0.

DeLaRosa was the winning pitcher going six innings giving up 0 runs on 1 hit. She had 11 strikeouts and gave up 4 walks.

Coach Scheopner said it was a great way to start the tournament.

Cochran had the only Goodland home run of the tournament, a double and a single. Berkley White and Hernandez each had a double. Rangel, Siruta and Raile each had a single.

Goodland Swim team placed fourth in league championships

The Goodland Swim Club placed fourth in the Northwest Kansas League Championship Meet held on Friday and Saturday at Colby. Swimmers won six individual events and two relay teams were winners and set pool records because it was a new pool and the distances were measured in meters. Eight teams competed at league.

Taryn Bedore (15-18 girls) set records in the 100-meter backstroke (1:21.83) and 100-meter butterfly (1:17.63) She placed second in the 100-meter freestyle (1:10.72), 50-meter freestyle (30.53) and 200-meter individual medley (3:08.78).

Dusty Johnson (11-12 boys) won gold in the 50-meter backstroke (39.63) and was second in the 100-meter freestyle (1:20.53), 50-meter freestyle (33.67), 100-meter individual medley (1:31.33) and 50-meter breaststroke (47.41).

Gerrell Miller (13-14 boys) was a winner in the 50-meter freestyle (30.22) and was the runner-up in the 100-meter freestyle (1:10.28), 200-meter freestyle (2:51.31) 100-meter backstroke (1:27.15) and 100-meter breaststroke (1:33.16).

Rachel Witman (9-10 girls) won the 25-meter butterfly (19.72) and Hagan Hoss won the 100-meter freestyle (3:06.34).

Eleven swimmers also won high point trophies for the season. They were Ethan McDaniel third, Jared Stoffel fifth, Rachel Witman fifth, Ryan Volk sixth, Johnson second, Hoss fourth, Levi House sixth, Gerrell Miller fifth, Bedore first, Ian Bonsall fifth and Holton Witman fourth.

The relay winners were the 8 and under mixed 100-meter medley (2:10.37) with Annika Linin, Jared Stoffel, Ethan McDaniel and Devontay Hardy swimming and the 11-12 mixed 200-meter freestyle (2:58.84) with Ryan Volk, Hannah Eslinger, Ellee McDaniel and Simon Bassett swimming.

League standing were the Colby Swim Club first with 329 points,

Wray Swim Club second with 284, Oberlin Swim Club third with 252, Goodland Swim Club fourth with 245, Holyoke Swim Club fifth with 160, Burlington Swim Team sixth with 141.5, Oakley Swim Team seventh with 69.5 and Flagler Swim Club eighth with 14.

In 8 and under girls Athena Armstrong was sixth in the 50-meter freestyle (59.06) and Sydney Hahn was sixth in the 25-meter backstroke (30.44).

The 8 and under girls 100-meter freestyle relay was fourth (2:34.12) with Olivia Bassett, Annika Linin, Sydney Hahn and Vivian Solomon swimming.

In 8 and under boys Ethan McDaniel was second in the 100-meter individual medley (2:22.14), second in the 50-meter freestyle (45.29), second in the 25-meter freestyle (18.88), third in the 25-meter backstroke (29.34) and second in the 25-meter butterfly (25.50); Jared Stoffel was fourth in the 100-meter individual medley (2:25.47), sixth in the 50-meter freestyle (55.68), fourth in the 25-meter backstroke (31.34) and third in the 25-meter breaststroke (30.67); and Devontay Hardy fifth in the 25-meter butterfly (32.50).

The 8 and under boys 100-meter freestyle was third (1:54.46) with Jared Stoffel, Walker Eslinger, Ethan McDaniel, and Hardy swimming.

In 9-10 girls Rachel Witman was fifth in the 100-meter individual medley (1:55.22) and fourth in the 25-meter backstroke (23.00) and Peri Sieck third in the 25-meter backstroke (22.97).

The 9-10 girls 100-meter freestyle was sixth (1:33.87) with Rachel Witman, Peri Sieck, Rebecca Lockhart and Athena Armstrong swimming.

The 9-10 girls 100-meter medley was sixth (1:57.27) with Rebecca Lockhart, Rachel Witman, Peri Sieck and Athena Armstrong swimming.

In 9-10 boys Ryan Volk was third in the 100-meter individual medley (2:02.97), fifth in the 100-meter freestyle (1:40.46), fourth in the 25-meter freestyle (17.80) sixth in the 25-meter backstroke (25.22) and fifth in the 25-meter butterfly (24.87) and Austin Hahn third in the 100-meter freestyle (1:34.02) and sixth in the 25-meter breaststroke (27.65).

In 11-12 girls Chalee Luther was second in the 100-meter freestyle (1:24.36) and fourth in the 50-meter backstroke (46.79) and Sianna Miller fourth in the 200-meter freestyle (3:21.94).

The 11-12 girls 200-meter freestyle was third (2:43.82) with Kinsey Volk, Mikayla Stoffel, Chalee Luther and Sianna Miller swimming.

The 11-12 girls 200-meter medley was sixth (3:25.84) with Kinsey Volk, Mikayla Stoffel, Chalee Luther and Sianna Miller swimming.

In 11-12 boys Hoss was third in the 100-meter freestyle (1:22.16), fourth in the 50-meter freestyle (36.20) and second in the 50-meter butterfly (45.81); House fourth in the 100-meter individual medley (1:39.78), sixth in the 100-meter freestyle (1:26.98), sixth in the 50-meter freestyle (36.73) and third in the 50-meter butterfly (47.91); Simon Bassett third in the 200-meter freestyle (3:22.23), fourth in the 50-meter backstroke (46.20) and fourth in the 50-meter breaststroke (49.22); and Peyton Sieck fifth in the 100-meter individual medley (1:43.82), fifth in the 50-meter freestyle (36.53) and fifth in the 50-meter butterfly (50.33).

The 11-12 boys 200-meter freestyle was second (2:24.12) with Johnson, Hoss, House and Peyton Sieck swimming.

The 11-12 boys 200-meter medley was second (2:59.84) with Johnson, Simon Bassett, Hoss and House swimming.

In 13-14 girls Savannah Bassett was sixth in the 100-meter butterfly (1:58.53).

The 13-14 girls 200-meter freestyle was fourth (3:01.40) with Savannah Bassett, Makayla Kennedy, Lindsey Geeska and Danielle McElhane swimming.

The 13-14 girls 200-meter medley was fifth (3:34.57) with Ellee McDaniel, Makayla Kennedy, Savannah Bassett and Hannah Eslinger swimming.

In 13-14 boys Aaron Avelar was fourth in the 400-meter freestyle

(7:12.45), sixth in the 200-meter freestyle (3:07.10) and fourth in the 50-meter freestyle (33.31).

In 15-18 Holton Witman was third in the 200-meter individual medley (3:03.32), sixth in the 100-meter freestyle (1:13.48), third in the 50-meter freestyle (29.13), second in the 100-meter butterfly (1:23.63) and fourth in the 100-meter breaststroke (1:31.58); Bonsall was second in the 100-meter freestyle

(1:03.63); and Timothy Fugleberg was third in the 100-meter backstroke (2:01.37).

The 15-18 mixed 200-meter freestyle was fifth (2:17.32) with Holton Witman, Fugleberg, Brooke Lockhart and Gerrell Miller swimming.

The 15-18 mixed 200-meter medley was second (2:26.58) with Bedore, Gerrell Miller, Holton Witman and Avelar swimming.

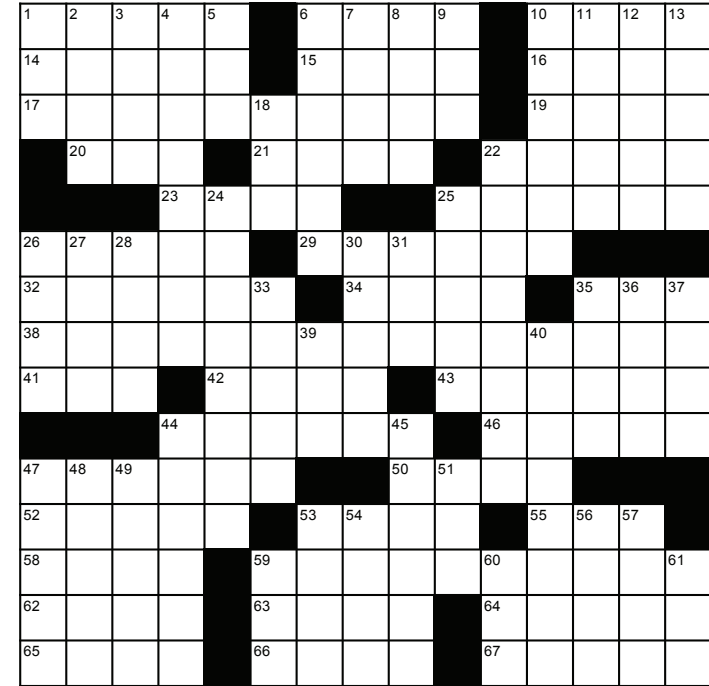
