There are still 25 Kansas Veterans missing in action from the Vietnam Vietnam's wartime control.

The number of Americans returned and identified since the end of the Vietnam War in 1975 is now 898; another 63 U.S. personnel, recovered post-incident and identified before the end of the war, bring the total to 961. Of the 1,685 unreturned American veterans from the Vietnam War, our POW/MIAs, 90 percent were lost in Vietnam or in areas of Laos and Cambodia under
