

Cowboys, Cowgirls, Mustangs run at Sugar Hills in season opening meet

Goodland High School and Grant Junior High competed in their home cross country invitational on a very, very hot Thursday at Sugar Hills Country Club. The course featured many up and down stretches for the runners.

The high school team only had runners in the freshman and sophomore races. Gerrell Miller came in seventh with a time of 20.27 minutes. Ace Arteaga was 11th with a time of 20.42. Jarod Lake was 26th with a 23.54, Jesse Cooper 27th with 24.02, Kameron Snyder 31st with 25.15, Ian Bonsall 32nd with 25.23. There were a total of 43 runners. The winner was Joshua Mehl of Wichita County with a time of 18.33.

The winner of the boys junior and senior race was Izzy Mendoza of Ulysses with a time at 17.25.

In the freshman and sophomore girls race Sierra Estes had the best finish coming in 13th with a time of 20.45. Cheyenne Prevatt came in 21st with a time of 25.0. The winner of race was Kelsey Crymble of Ogallala with a time of 17.31. There were 25 girls in the race.

The winner of the junior and senior girls race was Emilea Finley of Colby with a time of 15.47. There were 22 girls running.

Linsey Geeseka was the only runner in the junior high girls race for Grant Junior High. She came in 9th with a time of 7.52. The winner was Andrea Galindo of Ulysses with a time of 6.54 minutes.

Grant Junior High's Aaron Arteaga won the junior high boys race with a time of 5.41 minutes. Mario Lazo was eighth with a time of 6.25, Daniel Cepeka 11th with a time of 6.34, Taitem Jones 28th with a time of 9.07 and Chandler Pettibone 29th with a time of 9.42. There were 32 runners.

In the boys team competition Ulysses was first with 46, Ogallala second with 64, Scott City third with 75, Lakin fourth with 102, Goodland fifth with 136, Colby sixth with 140 and Wichita County seventh with 171. Oakley and Perkins County did not have enough runner for a team score.

The winner of the girls team competition was Ogallala with 36 points. Oakley was second with 40, Colby third with 52, Ulysses fourth with 52, Scott City fifth with 62 and Wichita County sixth with 63. Goodland, Lakin and Perkins County did not have enough runners for a team score.

The next race for high school and junior high teams will be at 8 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 10, at Tribune.
