

# Burlington wins season opening volleyball quad

The Cowgirls had their first volleyball matches of the season Tuesday at a home quad against Hays High, Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays and the Burlington Cougars.

In the varsity round robin the Cowgirls played the Monarchs of Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays. In the first game the girls fought hard to catch up to the Monarchs but did not have the momentum to take the lead and lost, 25-20. The Cowgirls played a more even match in the second game but still lost, 25-23.

In the second match the Cowgirls won the first game against Hays High 25-20 but then lost the other two, 25-19 and 25-21.

Hays High defeated Thomas More Prep-Marian, 25-20 and 25-21. Burlington beat Hays High, 25-9 and 25-20. Thomas More Prep-Marian beat Burlington, 15-25, 25-23 and 25-19.

In the final match the Cowgirls won the first game against Burlington, 25-20 but lost the next two, 25-18 and 25-11.

In team results Burlington was 2-1, Hays Thomas More-Prep 2-1, Hays High 2-1 and Goodland 0-3.

"Overall I was pleased with our play," said Coach Barb Bedore. "All

of the matches were close and with a little better execution on a few plays the outcome of the matches would have been different."

The junior varsity had a round robin. Hays High beat Goodland, 25-8 and 25-16. Burlington beat Thomas More Prep-Marian 25-13 and 25-15.

Thomas More Prep-Marian beat Goodland. Burlington beat Hays High 25-16 and 25-17. Hays High beat Thomas More Prep-Marian 25-8 and 25-20.

Burlington beat Goodland 25-22 and 25-16.

The teams results were Burlington 3-0, Thomas More Prep-Marian 1-2, Hays High 2-1 and Goodland 0-3.

In the C team round robin Hays High beat Thomas More Prep-Marian 25-16 and 25-16; Goodland beat Hays High 25-22 and 25-21; Burlington beat Thomas More Prep-Marian 25-16 and 25-12; Goodland beat Thomas More Prep-Marian 25-10 and 25-13; and Hays High beat Burlington 22-25, 25-16 and 15-3.

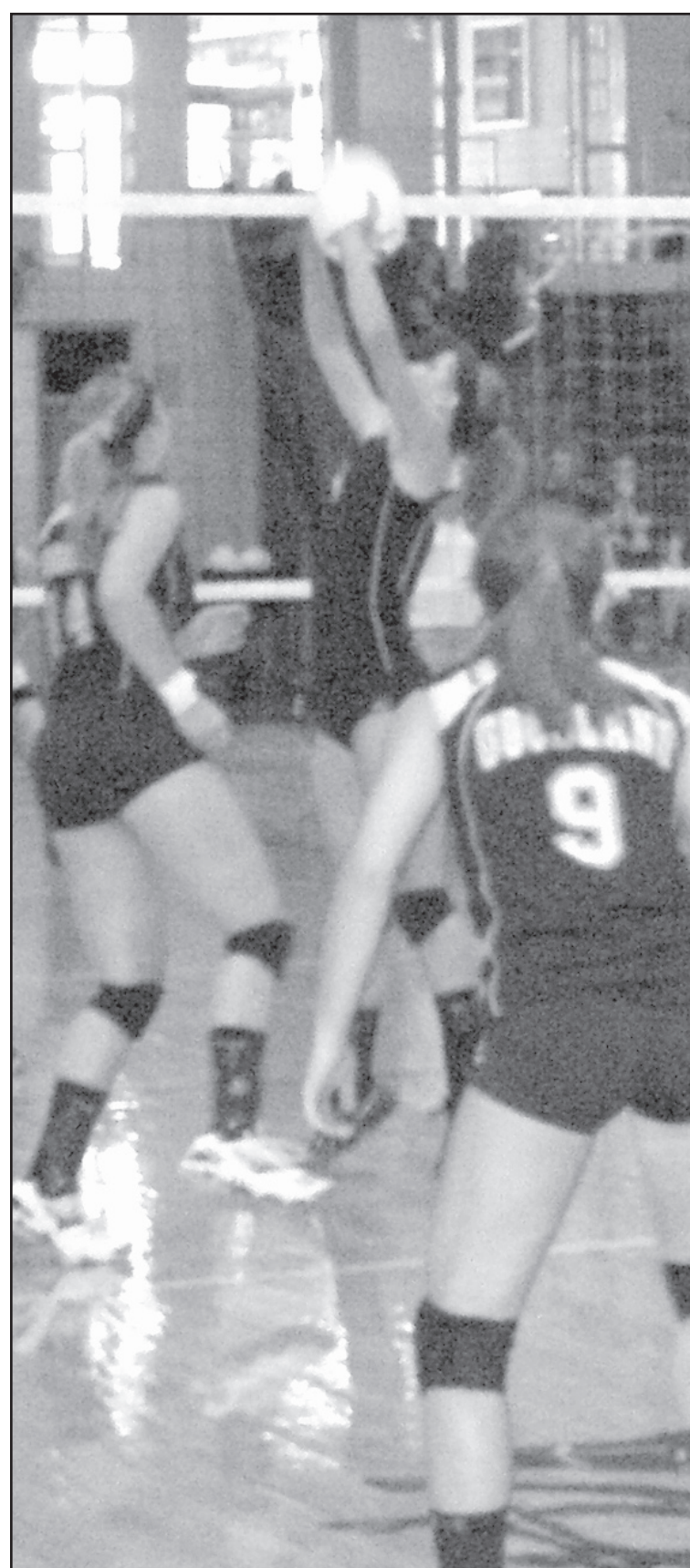
The Cowgirls travel to Machebeuf in Colorado for matches on Saturday beginning at 8 a.m.

The Mustang Junior High cross country team went to the Thomas More Prep Invitational on Saturday at Hays.

"This was the first year for the TMP Invitational so numbers were somewhat low yet. Goodland competed against Ness City and Lyons," said Coach James Myers.

"Arron Arteaga won his second race in a row in near record time. Arron was just 2 seconds off the school record for two miles in cross country on Saturday. He followed the winning performance at the Goodland Invitational on Thursday.

"Mario Lazo finished second and Daniel Cepeda fourth, both looked very strong. Taitem Jones and Chandler Pettibone continue to make improvements while earning seventh

and eighth place medals. Yidam Mendoza was held out this week, because of an injury, but has looked very good early in the season.

"Our lone junior high girl on the squad, Lindsey Geeseka ran well in her third place finish. She looks like with a little more experience she is going to be an excellent runner for us," said Coach Myers.

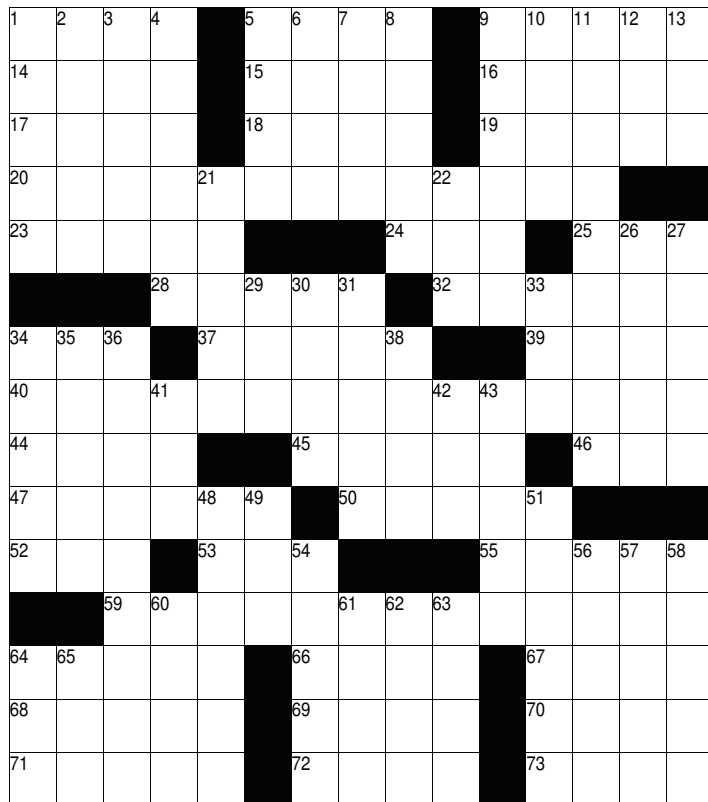
Results from the invitational were Arteaga first with a time of 12:33, Lazo second with 13:59, Cepeda fourth with 15:15, Jones seventh with 20:41, Pettibone eighth with 21:03 and Geeseka third with 16:08.

"Coach Waugh and myself are proud of these young kids," said Coach Myers. "They are working hard and improving. It is fun to see the improvement."
