The Goodland Cowgirls volleyball teams played in a home quad on Tuesday night at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The next match for the Cowgirls is Saturday in a quad at Max Jones Fieldhouse starting at 9 a.m.

In varsity action Goodland beat Leoti, 25-8 and 25-9. Lakin defeated Goodland, 25-20 and 25-13. Scott City beat Lakin, 25-15 and 25-16 and Lakin defeated Leoti, 25-13 and 25-8. Scott City beat Goodland, 25-14, 22-25 and 27-25 and Leoti 25-12 and 25-11.

The Cowgirls were 1-2 for the quad. Scott City was 3-0, Lakin 2-1 and Leoti 0-3.

"Play was very inconsistent," said Coach Barb Bedore. "The second and third sets against Scott City were the two best sets we played during the season so far."

In junior varsity action Goodland beat Leoti 25-9 and 25-13 and Lakin 25-22 and 25-20. Scott City beat Leoti 25-11 and 25-20. Lakin beat Scott City 30-28, 23-25 and 15-2. Scott City beat Goodland 25-12 and 25-14 and Lakin beat Leoti.

Goodland went 2-1, Scott City 3-0, Lakin 2-1 and Leoti 0-3.

They played in the Bishop Machebeuf volleyball tournament on Saturday at Denver.

The Cowgirls lost their four matches against Bishop Machebeuf of Denver; St. Mary's of Colorado Springs, Colo.; Weld Central of Keenesburg, Colo.; and Fleming of Fleming, Colo.

The Cowgirls won the second game, 25-16 against St. Mary's. They lost the first game 25-11 and the third game 12-25.

In the games against Bishop Machebeuf the Cowgirls lost 26-24 and 25-21.

Against Weld Central the Cowgirls lost, 25-15 and 25-17 and against Fleming they lost 25-16 and 25-10.

St. Mary's was the champion of the tournament.

Golfers finish sixth at Garden City tournament

Goodland Cowgirls played their second tournament at Buffalo Dunes in Garden City on Monday finishing sixth in the field of 12 teams.

Garden City won their tournament with a total of 315. Maize was second 349, Hays third 352, Syracuse fourth 383, Goodland fifth 399, Goodland sixth 422, Dodge City seventh 431, Holcomb eighth 439, Ulysses ninth 465, Liberal 10th 500, Lakin 11th 502 and Great Bend 12th 513.

Jazz Weis led the Cowgirls with a 98, Shaina Varney had a 107, Cortney Cowan 108, Emily Purvis 109, Jordan Knitig 113 and Kristi Stasser 118.

"I was really pleased with how the girls played," said Coach Connie Livengood. "We got beat by 4A, 5A and 6A schools and we only lost to Syracuse who will be in our division later on at regionals."

"I am starting to see some consistency from the younger girls and that is exciting. We are already at mid-season."

"Buffalo Dunes is a tough course if you have never played it and I have to commend the three freshmen who went Monday and played, Shaina Varney, Emily Purvis and Kristi Stasser. Emily improved her score once again. Cortney and Jordan stayed around the same as what they have been hitting this year. Cortney shot a 49 on the front side but came back with a 59 on the back."

"I think we can improve on some of the little things. Jazz led the team today, but did not score as well as she is capable of doing."

"I am looking forward for the girls at the end of the season. We are getting better and that is fun to see."

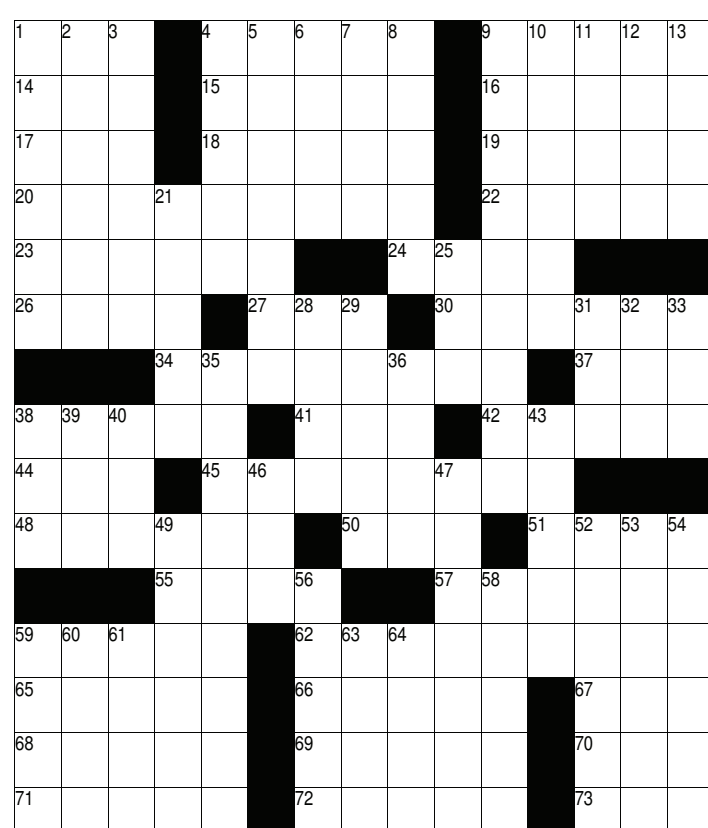
Assistant Coach Amy Cebula thought the day went well and the girls played well, Livengood said.
