

# Cowgirls take second at league golf tournament

*Regional tournament to be Monday morning at Syracuse golf course*

The Goodland Cowgirls finished second in the Great Western Conference tournament held Monday in Hugoton, and had four team members medal.

“We had a good day,” said Coach Connie Livengood. “Our team continues to improve. We will be in contention for going to state again, however, we need to have all six girls playing at their best.”

Colby won the Conference title with a team score of 392, with Goodland in second at 398, and Holcomb third with 401. Ulysses was fourth at 418, and Hugoton fifth with 495.

Cowgirl Jazz Weis placed second and medaled with a score of 89. The top golfer was Kaylee Keck of Colby who had an 82. Weis had a 44 on the front nine and 45 on the back nine.

“Glad Jazz stayed in the 80s,” Livengood said. “She is going to do fine down the stretch for our team.”

Shaina Varney placed seventh and medaled with a score of 100. Shaina Varney had her personal best of a score of 100, Livengood said. Varney had an even 50 on both of the nine-holes.

Emily Purvis shot a 103 and medaled at 12th. Purvis had a personal best nine-hole round of 49 on the back nine. She had a 54 on the front nine, Livengood said.

Jordan Knitig shot a 106 and medaled at 15th. She had a great first round with a 48 and then had a little trouble finishing with a 58, Livengood said.

Cortney Cowan shot a 107 and was just out of medal range.

Megan Siruta shot a 109.

The Cowgirls will be getting ready for the regional 3A tournament to be held at 9 a.m. on Monday at Syracuse. Other teams in the regional tournament include Syracuse, Holcomb, Lakin, St. Francis and Sublette.

Other Cowgirls went to Hays to play in the Thomas-More Prep Marion tournament, Livengood said.

Katelyn Coon finished her high school career with a good round of 117.

“That is a good score for Smokey Hills Golf Course,” Livengood said, “if you have never played it before.”

Miranda Hernandez finished well with a 122.

Freshman Kristi Stasser and Sophia Thompson with 133s, and Michaela Garrett finished with a 152.

Livengood said the girls played well, and the younger girls will have that experience to build on next year.
