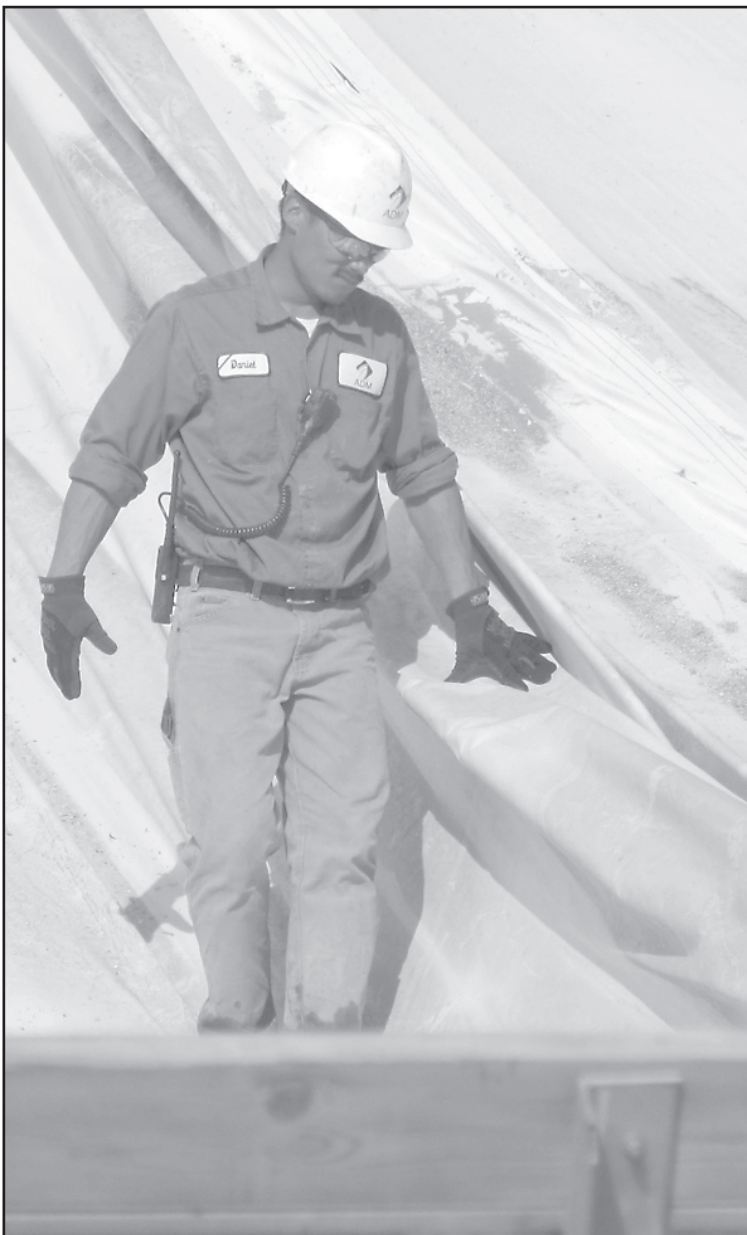


ADM transfers corn to growing pile

they might give the first load to the contractor to get them out of the transfer station.
Enfield said he felt it was fair to the taxpayers if the county can recover some of the labor cost.
• Vandiver said he feels the transfer station is running better and is cleaner and working well.
• On the spray trucks Vandiver said he had checked on chemical injection, and talked to Bob Owen. He had two quotes on upgrading the spray trucks to be able to carry up to four chemicals.
There was some question about

the two bids and Vandiver said he would check that out.
Enfield asked about a bid from another company, and Vandiver said they do not do the injection system.
Strnad asked if the county can buy a new truck and transfer this to a new truck.
"Yes," Vandiver said. "We wanted something that was transferrable. This system will actually transfer to a larger tank and truck. The controllers we have will not work on this system."
Enfield said he would like to see one of these trucks.
Vandiver said he will find out

where they might be, and knows that Gove County has one of the brands.
• On prairie dogs, Vandiver asked if the commissioners want to stay with the same process. He said the county will get permission from those who want to have their prairie dogs treated.
Strnad said the county is not subsidizing the bait, and thinks the farmers and ranchers should pay for the bait when they pick it up.
Vandiver said they can make it cash on delivery.
Linin asked if the county charges for doing the treatment.
Vandiver said there is a charge for

the equipment, bait and labor. He said the county is within compliance with equipment.
• Enfield asked about the crack sealing on old U.S. 24 and County Road 64.
Vandiver said he has talked to the city about how they do it, and they will let the county use their machine and have a city employee go with the county employees for training.
He said from Goodland to the state line he has counted about 2,600 cracks. He said there is a formula to figure out how many pounds of seal are needed. He said he will count the cracks from Goodland east to Brewster.

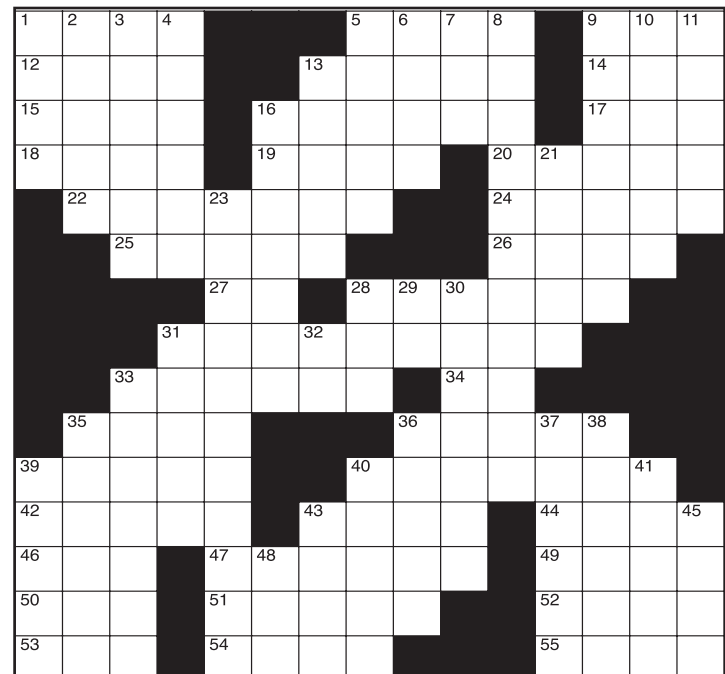
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Crossword Puzzle
