

Cowgirls second in league, 3A sub-state Saturday

Cowgirls Volleyball Team finished second in the Great Western Conference tournament held Saturday, and will face the top-seed in the Class 3A Sub-State Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The 3A Volleyball Sub-State will begin at 1 p.m. on Saturday with Goodland (13-19) facing No. 1 seed Cimarron (34-3) on the north court and No. 2 seed Phillipsburg (31-6) will play Norton (12-18) on the south court.

In the second set of games Kismet-Southwestern Heights (24-1) will play Lakin (21-14) on the north court and Scott City (26-11) will play Holcomb (16-15) on the south court.

In the second round the winners will play on the same court they were on in the opening round. The final match will be on the north court.

The winner will advance to the State Class 3A tournament at the Salina Bicentennial Center on Oct. 28-29.

A total of 63 Class 3A teams are involved in sub-state matches with the top eight advancing to the state tournament in Salina.

Great West Conference

Colby won the Great Western Activity Conference volleyball tournament at Max Jones Fieldhouse on Saturday. Goodland was second, Scott City third, Holcomb fourth, Ulysses fifth and Hugoton sixth.

The Cowgirls opened with a win over Holcomb, losing the first game 25-22, but they came back to win the next two 25-22 and 25-19.

Goodland took the Ulysses Tigers to the third game, losing the first 25-13, but winning the second game 25-15. Goodland lost the third game 25-18.

The Cowgirls were forced to three games by Scott City, winning the first game 25-14. In the second game Scott City had a lead, but the Cowgirls were able to come back to tie the score at 24-24. However,

Triangular meet Tuesday

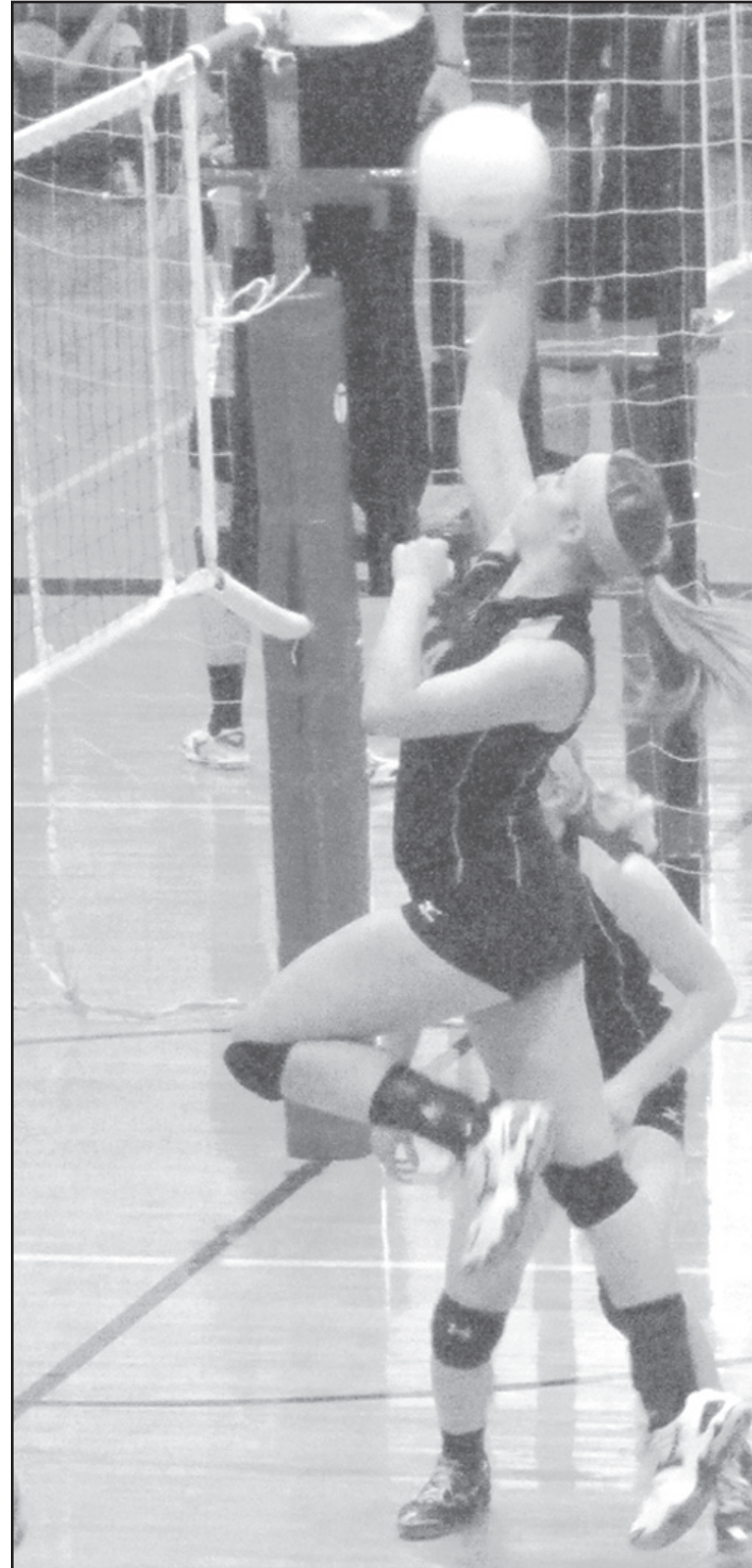
Tuesday the Cowgirls had a varsity and junior varsity triangular with Ulysses and Norton at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Goodland Cowboys cross country team finished sixth at the league cross country meet in Ulysses on Saturday.

Coach Jim Meyers said the Great Western Activity Conference has four outstanding teams at the meet.

"Hugoton was first as they placed five runners in the top 10," he said.

"That is unbelievable. Add to that Scott City was second, Ulysses third and Holcomb fourth. Those are some pretty tough Cross Country teams.

"Most of our kids ran personal bests of their career and still had trouble staying up with these teams

in our league.

"We were without Jarod Lake who had another commitment on Saturday. I am proud of the kids' effort. Especially Kyler Amthor, who ran the race with a very sore sprained foot. He made it through. Although it was not his best time, he wanted to give it a try."

For the Cowgirls, Sierra Estes placed 15th with a time of 18 minutes 59 seconds.

For the Cowboys, Ace Arteaga was 24th in 18.47, second fastest time of his career.
