Coach Steve Lampe said it was a historic first to have the two local college teams meet in a dual at Northwest Tech. Another dual is planned for January in Colby,


Lampe said he knew the Trojans had a good team, and was glad his team was able to get a couple of wins in the dual with one pin and a 6-5 decision.


