Carroll A. Mogge, 93, lifetime Sherman County farmer, died Wednesday, Nov. 30, 2011 at Wheat Ridge Acres Retirement Community at Goodland.

He was born May 21, 1918, to Mae (Nelson) and George Mogge at Goodland. In 1936 he graduated from Sherman Community High School at Goodland.

Mr. Mogge was a veteran of World War II, serving with the Naval Air Corps in the European and Asiatic Theaters of operation. Upon his return from military service, he and Marie M. Meinen were married on Feb. 24, 1946, at Goodland. In 1947 he completed his degree in agriculture at Kansas State University at Manhattan.

He was an avid stamp collector. Mr. Mogge served in many community and church activities including First United Methodist Church, Sherman County Extension Board, Farm Bureau Board, Northwest Kansas Medical Center Board,
