In the first half of the game the Cowboys had trouble scoring against the Norton Bluejays who led 12-4 after the first and 21-12 at halftime.

When the Cowboys came back out for the second half there appeared to be a change as Goodland began to find the range and to play as a team. The Cowboys comeback was sparked by the shooting of Ryan Hillmer who led the Cowboys scoring with 19 points getting eight in the third quarter and eight in the fourth quarter. Taylen Smith was a close second with 18 points scoring eight in the third quarter and four in the fourth.

The Cowboys outscored the Bluejays 20-12 in the third quarter to be one point behind the Bluejays, 33-32, going into the final quarter.
