games, but almost every American who reaches retirement age will receive Social Security retirement benefits. In fact, 96 percent of Americans are covered by Social If you're ready to retire in the near future,

this article is for you. We'd like to share with you a few important items about Social Security retirement benefits and how to apply for them.

When you work and pay Social Security taxes, you earn "credits" toward Social Se-

curity benefits. If you were born in 1929 or can retire as early as age 62, but if benefits later, you need 40 credits (10 years of work) start before you reach your full retirement to qualify for retirement benefits.

To qualify for retirement benefits, 10 years is the minimum. However, the amount of your benefit is determined by how long you work and how much you earn. Higher lifetime earnings result in higher benefits. If there were some years when you did not work or had low earnings, your benefit amount may be lower than if you had worked steadily or earned more.

Your age when you retire makes a difgradually rising from age 65 to age 67. You reach age 70.
