Kim Coslett and her husband Kirt are owners of the Kaleo Café in Halstead. They are natives, having grown up in the area. Kim is from Sedgwick, north of Wichita. She is trained as a nurse.

Kim and Kirt worked for a year at a hunting preserve in the Adirondack Mountains of New York and then chose to move back to Kansas. Kim became a licensed nurse in Halstead and eventually the family settled there. Kirt, has his own roofing company, Coslett Roofing. They
