\$268,000 worth of equipment housed in Brewster used and maintained by the district. Crumrine said the district takes in about \$7,000 a year from a 1.418-mill propertytax levy, and pays Sherman County \$5,000 a year to help provide equipment and protection to people in the district. The \$5,000 payment falls short of Sherman County's operating costs for the district, he said, adding that it costs about \$9,500 a year for fuel, salaries and training.

Sherman County wants the district to take over operations and buy the equipment from the county, the men said. Instead of the district paying \$5,000, Sherman would pay the district \$10,000 a year to operate and provide protection. The city provides

"I don't know if we can generate enough money to own the equipment, run it appropriately and update it, too," Crumrine said. They (Sherman County) do a phenomenal job, and I don't think people realize that they've been getting by on a song for the get a fair deal.' last 20 years."

Sherman County has a mill levy of 4.552 mills that covers the entire county, which takes in much more than the district could.
