

Wrestlers take fourth at league tournament

Despite having a half-dozen open weight classes, the Goodland High School varsity wrestling team took fourth in the Great West Activities Conference tournament in Holcomb on Saturday.

Colby took the top spot, with Hugoton in second place and Scott City in third. Ulysses took fifth and Holcomb, sixth. Goodland lost its first dual with Hugoton 45-33.

James Dinkel and Aaron Avelar won

by forfeit. Colton Cooper won a 3-0 decision. Tyler Gastineau won by fall in just 21 seconds.

Mac Purvis lost by fall. The Cowboys won their second dual, beating Ulysses 36-30. Both teams had several open weight classes.

Avelar got an 8-4 win. Coy Johnson lost by fall. Drew Dautel lost.

Cooper was behind 1-0 going into the third period in his match. He got an escape

to tie the match, which went into double overtime before he got another escape to win 2-1.

Laine Herl, in his first match of the day, won by fall.

There was some confusion over the score, which originally had Ulysses winning the match 36-24. The officials finally settled on a 36-30 Goodland victory.

The Cowboys cruised to another win in the third round, this time bearing Holcomb

45-25.

Johnson, Corey Davis and Dinkel all lost. Dautel won an 8-4 decision, but with the rest of the weight classes open on Holcomb's side, Goodland ended up on top.

The Cowboys lost the fourth round against Scott City 48-24. Avelar won in overtime.

Goodland faced rival Colby in the final round 54-18. The Eagles had already secured first place in the tournament with wins

in the first four rounds.

Avelar got another overtime win, this time a 6-4 decision. Johnson and Dautel both lost.

Avelar placed first in the 106 pound class and Herl place first at 195 with five wins each. Cooper placed second at 160 with a 4-1 record. Jason Cowan got third at 170. Gastineau got second at 182.

Open classes lead to 48-30 loss at home Thursday

The Cowboys had a busy weekend, so several wrestlers sat out the dual against Scott City on Thursday.

Riley Oharah, 220, Mac Purvis, 285, and Austin Avelar, 120, did not wrestle. The Cowboys also had an open spot at 126. Brook Bahe, who was injured several weeks ago at Hays, is out for the season.

Things didn't start well for the Cowboys against the aggressive Scott City team. Aaron Avelar, 106, lost a 3-0 decision and Coy Johnson, 113, lost by fall.

At 132, Corey Davis had a long match against Scott City's Clay Mulligan. Davis was taken down three times in the first period but escaped each time. The score was 18-7 against Davis when he was pinned for a loss.

James Dinkel, 138, was behind 5-1 when he nearly pinned Marshall Hutchins. Hutchins escaped and ended up beating Dinkel 9-4.

Jed Gray, 145, also nearly won by fall over Devyn Egelston, but the Scott City wrestler was able to turn the tables and pin Gray for a loss.

Things turned around in the later weight classes. At 152, John Peden was ahead 16-4 when he pinned Scott City's Thomas Chambliss for a win.

Colton Cooper, 160, won by fall with six second left in the first period. Jason Cowan, 170, pinned his opponent in just 28 seconds.

At 182, Tyler Gastineau won by fall 16 seconds into the second period and Laine Herl continued his winning streak with a win by fall at 1:16 in the second period.

With all the open classes, the Cowboys lost 48-30.

The dual included four junior varsity matches.

At 113, Josh Davis lost a 7-2 decision to Scott City's Chase Ramsey. At 132, Ricky Milke hung in there against Scott City's Alonso

Hermosillo. The two were tied 3-3 going into the third period, but Hermosillo scored four points to win the match 7-3.

Jeff House, 152, won by fall just one minute into the match.

Milke wrestled another junior varsity match after the varsity matches had concluded. He won by fall over Scott City's Peter Nguyen.

The wrestlers also traveled to Oakley on Friday before the Great West Activities Conference on Saturday.
