An item on Page 5 of the Tuesday, March 20, edition of the Goodland Star-News truncated portions of a meeting between the Sherman County Commissioners and Shirley Weber of the Northwest Local Environmental Protection Group. Weber had come to the commissioners to inform them that the group is in danger of losing its funding from the state, and has a lobbyist in Topeka working to keep them funded. She also spoke to them about cesspools - unlined holes in the ground to dispose of waste-which are illegal, but those built before 1992 have been grandfathered in. There was a bill in the Kansas Senate about

the issue.
