

Cowboy baseball team gets first win of the season

The Cowboy baseball team got its first victory of the season in the second game of a doubleheader Friday afternoon at Scott City.

The boys won the second game 11-4 after losing the first 6-4.

Coach Devlin Mull said they were able to string some hits together and did much better scoring.

The next double header for the Cowboys is at 3 p.m. Thursday against Hugoton at Memorial Field.

At the top of the first inning in game one, the first three batters for the Cowboys were up and all were out. Scott City did no better in their turn at bat. The score was 0-0.

In the top of the second Ryder Kling hit a double and Taylen Smith, Sheldon Nelson and John Hendrich walked. Kling walked home for what would have been the first run of the game, but the Scott City's coach appealed because Kling did not touch home base. The umpire ruled Kling out and the run did not stand. In the bottom of the first the Cowboys struck three Scott City players out. The score remained at 0-0.

At the top of the third the Scott City pitcher walked two batters in

row and was replaced. Helton and Kling then struck out and Taylen Smith got out on a fly ball. The Scott City pitcher, Brett O'neil, team hit a triple. The next batter Matthew Zilla walked. Both were batted in by Jeremy Clinton putting the Beavers up by two. Clinton also scored, giving Scott City a 3-0 at the end of the inning.

In the top of the fourth Goodland's batters went down in order. Scott City's Juan Rodriguez scored on an error by Helton. O'neil hit a single and scored when Zilla batted him in.

Scott City lead 5-0 going into the top of the fifth, but then the Cowboys started to battle back, with Ryan Hillmer and Helton getting across the plate to make it 6-2.

Scott City's Devyn Eggleston hit a line drive to first, stole second, went to third and scored in the bottom of the fifth. The score was Scott City, 6-2.

Goodland had three up and three down again in the top of the sixth. In the bottom of the inning, Helton started pitching for the Cowboys. For Scott City, Zilla hit a single but Clinton was out on a fly ball. Drew Kite got thrown out on a ground ball

by Helton and Tyler Hess got out when Hillmer caught his fly ball.

In the top of the seventh Austin Avelar and Helton scored with Smith getting the RBI. The final score was 6-4 in favor of Scott City.

In game two, Avelar, Hillmer and Helton scored in the top of the first, with Helton and Kling earning RBIs.

Helton started as pitcher in that game. The first batter for Scott City was thrown out by the Cowboy shortstop. The next two hit singles and one walked, but Helton then struck out the last two batters. The score had Goodland on top 3-0.

In the top of the second the Cowboys had three outs and left men on second and third. The first batter for Scott City walked. The second batter was out on a fly ball and the third batter was out on a field combination. The score remained 3-0.

In the top of the third the Cowboys were retired in order. The first two players for Scott City were out. One batter walked, but the next was struck out to end the inning.

Kyler Amthor and Nelson walked and Hillmer had a base hit in the top of the fourth. Avelar hit a double

and earned two RBI's. He went on to score and Helton also scored on a double. Goodland led 8-0. Kling went to first, earning an RBI, but was later out on a slide to home plate. Smith had a base hit and scored on a base hit by Tyler Jones. Scott City made no scores, leaving Goodland with a 9-0.

At the top of the fifth inning the Cowboys had three up and three out. Austin Avelar relieved Helton on the mound. He walked the next four batters, forcing home Clinton for Scott City. Hillmer relieved Avelar and struck the next three out. The score was Goodland leading, 9-1.

At the top of the sixth Helton and Kling scored. Laine Herl batted the two in for RBIs. In the bottom of the inning, Scott City's pitcher added a run. The score stood at Goodland, 11-2.

In the seventh inning the Cowboys had three out and two left on base. Scott City added two more runs to their score. Goodland won, 11-4.

The season record for the Cowboys is one win and three losses. The first two losses were against Burlington two weeks ago before Spring Break.

Track team has two firsts at Ulysses

Two Goodland Cowboys got first place in their events at the track team's first meet of the season Friday in Ulysses.

Dax Ruhs got first in the javelin with a throw of 148 feet, seven inches. Holton Whitman got first in the pole vault with a leap of 12 feet.

Other placings include:

Todd Sneathen, fourth in the 200 meters with 24.37.

Reed Bellamy, second in the 300-meter hurdles with 41.31 and sixth in the 110 hurdles with 16.72.

Ian Bonsall, fifth in the 300-meter hurdles with 44.70.

The 4-by-100 meter relay team of Ruhs, Bellamy, Sneathen and Riley Oharah placed third with 45.50.

The 4-by-400 meter relay team of Bellamy, Colton Cooper, Oharah and Sneathen placed third with 3:37.12.

The 4-by-800 meter relay team of Xavier Foust, Ace Arteaga, Josh Whisnart and Cooper placed sixth with 9:36.98.

On the girls side, Jordan Knitig got second place in the pole vault with a vault of 7 feet, six inches.

Cortney Cowan, fifth in the shot put with 28 feet and fourth in the discus with of 85 feet, 2 inches.

Sydney Winston, fifth in the discus with 84 feet, 11 inches.

Chantel Coates, fourth in the high jump with 4 feet, 2 inches and fourth in the pole vault with

7 feet.

Taryn Bedore, sixth in the high jump with 4 feet 2 inches and fifth in the 300-meter hurdles with 53.83.

Nicole Sederstrom, fifth in the triple jump with 30 feet, 4 inches.

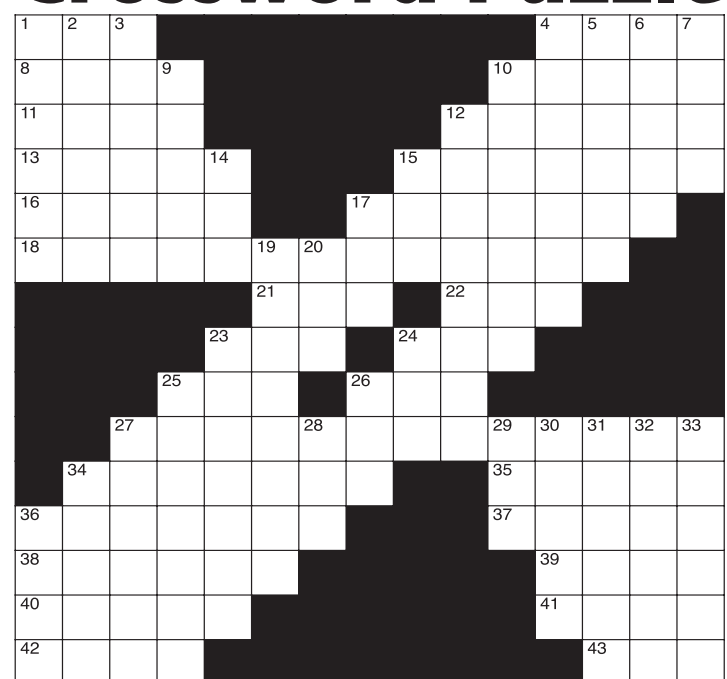
Mara Kling, fourth in the 400 meters with 63.61.
