

# owntown project to include water line replacement

The city commission approved the addition to the project at their April 16 meeting. The addition is to install a 10-inch main water line and 10-inch service lines between 11th and

Gerber said the water line replacement got missed from the original project specifica-

staff had been working with the contractor, Smoky Hill, to get a bit of about \$180,000. He did not have a firm quote at the meeting, so he asked the commissioners to approve the contract as long as it didn't exceed \$180,000.

Gerber said the grant that is helping pay for the brick replacement wouldn't have covered the water lines even if they had been in the original projects specs.


