sports_ Cowboys drop two to Thomas More Prep

The Cowboys got down 4-1 in game one and were not able to recover. It was even worse in the game two, when they got down 6-0 in the top of the second and were unable to score a run.

The team had a quick turnaround this week, playing Lakin at home Monday. They are scheduled to play at Holcomb on Thursday.

Austin Avelar – who is in the midst of a five-game hitting streak - pitched a complete game in game one of the home doubleheader. He and Cowboys held the Monarchs scoreless in the top of the first. In their half of the inning, however, the Cowboys went down 1-2-3 with a fly out from Ryan Hillmer and, a caught line drive to left field by Avelar a strikeout for Ryder Kling.

The Monarchs put the first run on the board on the top of the second. The lead-off batter got three bases after his hit to right field bounced up and over Cy Paxton. He came home on a base hit. Avelar got two straight strikeouts, then a ground out to end the inning.

All three Cowboys, Gunner Helton, Laine Herl and Taylen Smith, were struck out in the bottom of the second, but the Monarchs didn't fare much better with a fly out, a strikeout and a ground out.
