

Golfers win prizes at Slice of Life tournament

There were four flights, with first, second and third place awarded in each flight.

Goodland swimmers break records at Saturday's meet in Burlington

The Goodland swimmers had another hot day for the meet at Burlington on Saturday, with lots of close races. Goodland won again with 302 points. The swimmers set three pool records, won 18 individual races and seven relay teams were winners.

The team will be at Oakley on Saturday and be at Goodland the following Friday and Saturday for the Northwest Kansas Swim League Championship meet.

The 15-18 mixed A team set records in both the freestyle and medley relays. The 200-yard medley broke a 22 year-old record. Goodland's time was (2:03.34) with Taryn Bedore (backstroke), Zach Miller (breaststroke), Holton Witman (butterfly) and Ian Bonsall (freestyle) swimming. The 200-yard freestyle relay record was set 25 years ago. Goodland's time was (1:46.06) with Holton Witman, Bedore, Zach Miller and Bonsall swimming.

Rachel Witman (9-10 girls) also won two first places, the 25-yard backstroke (19.64) and the 25-yard butterfly (18.18) and got second in the 25-yard breaststroke (22.86).

Dusty Johnson (13-14 boys) picked up two wins, winning the 200-yard freestyle (2:33.33) and 100-yard backstroke (1:18.30).

Bonsall was a winner in the 100-yard freestyle (53.57) and the 50-yard freestyle (23.85).

Peyton Sieck (11-12 boys) won the 200-yard freestyle (3:05.02).

Other relay team winners were in the 8 and under girls 100-yard medley (1:45.61) with Sydney Hahn, Olivia Bassett, Lindsey Cure and Nemechek; 8 and under mixed 100-yard freestyle (2:07.41) with Cole Linton, Walker Eslinger, Blair Linin and Vivian Solomon; 9-10 girls 100-yard freestyle (1:12.14) with Rachel Witman, Lauren Cure, Rebecca Lockhart and Peri Sieck; 9-10 girls 100-yard medley (1:28.78) with Peri Sieck, Lockhart, Rachel Witman and Lauren Cure; and 11-12 boys 200-yard freestyle (2:20.36) with House, Chase Johnson, Peyton Sieck and Ryan Volk.

In 8 and under boys Devontey Hardy was fifth in the 50-yard freestyle (51.23) and Linkon Cure fourth on the 25-yard backstroke (33.17).

The 8 and under boys 100-yard freestyle relay was second (1:39.20) with Ethan McDaniel, Dexter Dautel, Linkon Cure and Hardy swimming.

The 8 and under boys 100-yard medley was second (2:00.03) with Linkon Cure, Ethan McDaniel, Hardy and Dautel swimming.

In 9-10 girls Peri Sieck was third in the 100-yard freestyle (1:24.3) and fifth in the 25-yard backstroke (21.16) and Lauren Cure fourth in the 25-yard freestyle (17.59).

In 9-10 boys Leyton Cure was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:28.15), second in the 25-yard freestyle (15.50) and fourth in the 25-yard butterfly (21.33).

In 11-12 girls Chalee Luther was second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:3.86), second in the 50-yard backstroke (40.15) and fourth in the 50-yard breaststroke (46.37); and Ellie McDaniel was third in the 200-yard freestyle (3:04.19), second in the 50-yard freestyle (34.77) and sixth in the 50-yard butterfly (47.33).

The 11-12 girls 200-yard freestyle was fourth (2:37.04) with Chalee Luther, Hannah Eslinger, Kaitlyn Townsend and Ellie McDaniel swimming.

The 11-12 girls 200-yard medley was second (3:10.84) with Townsend, Hannah Eslinger, Chalee Luther and Ellie McDaniel swimming.

In 11-12 boys Peyton Sieck was also second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:13.85); Powell Sieck was second in the 50-yard backstroke (44.00), fifth in the 50-yard butterfly (46.42) and fourth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:40.55); Chase Johnson was sixth in the 100-yard

freestyle (1:23.43), sixth in the 50-yard butterfly (48.65) and sixth in the 50-yard breaststroke (53.47); Austin Hahn was sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (37.30) and fifth in the 50-yard breaststroke (52.02); Ryan Volk was third in the 50-yard freestyle (35.58).

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard freestyle relay was fourth (3:18.86) with Teryn Teeter, Austin Hahn, Champ King and Savannah Solomon swimming.

In 13-14 girls Sianna Miller was third in the 50-yard freestyle (32.14).

The 13-14 girls 200-yard freestyle was sixth (2:38.81) with Kinsey Volk, Lindsey Geeska, Kyndell King and Sianna Miller swimming.

In 13-14 boys Dusty Johnson was also third in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:30.49); Hagan Hoss second in the 100-yard freestyle (1:06.78), second in the 50-yard freestyle (27.70) and second in the

100-yard butterfly (1:27.93); and Simon Basset was fourth in the 200-yard freestyle (2:49.96) and fifth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:32.51).

The 15-18 boys 200-yard freestyle was second (2:07.88) with Dusty Johnson, Simon Bassett, Hoss and Powell Sieck swimming.

The 13-14 boys 200-yard medley was second (2:36.91) with Dusty Johnson, Simon Bassett, Hoss and Ryan Volk swimming.

In 15-18 boys Holton Witman was second in the 50-yard freestyle (25.61), second in the 100-yard butterfly (1:10.52) and third in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:22.41); Zach Miller was fourth in the 50-yard freestyle (26.80), second in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:17.63) and third in the 200-yard individual medley (2:50.95); Aaron Avelar was third in the 200-yard freestyle (2:43.77), sixth in the 50-yard freestyle (29.34) and fourth in the 100-yard backstroke (1:40.54); Gerell Miller was

second in the 100-yard backstroke (1:13.38) and fourth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:23.94); and Coy Johnson was fifth in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:34.30).

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard freestyle B team was fifth (2:16.08) with Rachel Witman, Makayla Kennedy, Avelar and Coy Johnson swimming.

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley B team was third (2:25.69) with Gerell Miller, Coy Johnson, Avelar and Rachel Horney swimming.

Also swimming were Jackson Daise and Truman Hooker.

In team results the Burlington Swim Team was second with 217.5 points, Colby Swim Club third with 212, Holyoke fourth with 206, Oberlin Swim Club fifth with 176, Wray Swim Club sixth with 173.5, Oakley Swim Team seventh with 52 and Flagler eighth with 33 points.
