

Swim team wins at Oakley

The Goodland Swim Team continued their winning ways by taking first at the Oakley Meet on Saturday. The weather was hot and some of the races were close. One highlight of the day was the 8 and under boys 100-yard freestyle relay winning first and second place. The A team won first (1:37.51) with Ethan McDaniel, Gantzen Miller, Dexter Dautel and Linkon Cure swimming. The B team was second (1:51.31) with second with Cole Linton, Devontey Hardy, Eli Green and Blair Linin swimming.

One record was set and swimmers won 14 individual races and five relays.

Goodland will host the two day Northwest Kansas Swim League Championship on Friday and Saturday.

Ethan McDaniel (8 and under boys) remained undefeated winning the 25-yard butterfly (21.81), 100-yard individual medley (1:50.45) and setting a pool record in the 25-yard freestyle (16.25).

Devinee Borgmann (11-12 girls) was a three time winner in the 50-yard freestyle (31.70), 50-yard butterfly (35.03) and the 50-yard breaststroke (42.25).

Levi House (11-12 boys) won the 100-yard freestyle (1:13.11), 100-yard individual medley (1:28.30) and placed second in the 50-yard butterfly (40.35).

Winning one race each were Gantzen Miller (8 and under boys) 25-yard backstroke (25.36), Rachel Witman (9-10 girls) 25-yard backstroke (20.06) and Chalee Luther (11-12 girls) 50-yard backstroke (41.20).

Dusty Johnson (13-14 boys) won the 400-yard freestyle (5:48.38), while Ian Bonsall (15-18 boys) won a close 50-yard freestyle (24.30) and Zach Miller (15-18 boys) grabbed a close race in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:16.32).

Other relay winners were 8 and under girls 100-yard freestyle (1:31.21) with Lindsey Cure, Olivia Bassett, Sydney Hahn and Mya Nemechek; 9-10 girls 100-yard medley (1:39.06) with Rachel Witman, Lauren Cure, Rebecca Lockhart and Annika Linin; 15-18 mixed A team 100-yard freestyle (1:52.03) with Holton Witman, Coy Johnson, Zach Miller and Bonsall; and 15-18 mixed A team 200-yard medley (2:04.30) with Gerell Miller, Zach Miller, Holton Witman and Bonsall.

In 8 and under girls Nemechek was second (41.19) in the 50-yard freestyle, second (19.27) in the 25-yard freestyle and second in the 25-yard backstroke (24.34); Lindsey Cure was third (43.98)

in the 50-yard freestyle, third (20.82) in the 25-yard freestyle and fourth (26.00) in the 25-yard backstroke; and Sydney Hahn was fourth (46.71) in the 50-yard freestyle, fifth (21.60) in the 25-yard freestyle and sixth (27.90) in the 25-yard backstroke.

In 8 and under boys Gantzen Miller was also second (48.03) in the 50-yard freestyle and fifth (2:16.87) in the 100-yard medley; Hardy was third (48.30) in the 50-yard freestyle and second (20.82) in the 25-yard freestyle; and Linkon Cure was fifth (31.10) in the 25-yard backstroke.

In 9-10 girls Rachel Witman was also second (16.61) in the 25-yard freestyle and third (22.90) in the 25-yard breaststroke (22.90) and Lauren Cure was fifth (18.40) and swam the 25-yard backstroke (24.80).

The 9-10 girls 100-yard freestyle relay was fourth (1:18.49) with Rachel Witman, Annika Linin, Rebecca Lockhart and Lauren Cure swimming.

In 9-10 boys Leyton Cure was second (1:22.98) in the 100-yard freestyle and second (15.78) in the 25-yard freestyle and Jackson Daise was sixth (28.45) in the 25-yard backstroke.

In 11-12 girls Luther was also sixth (45.26) in the 50-yard breaststroke and Ellie McDaniel was third (1:17.75) in the 100-yard freestyle, third (33.80) in the 50-yard freestyle and third (1:32.41) in the 100-yard individual medley.

The 11-12 girls 200-yard medley relay was second (2:53.44) with Kaitlyn Townsend, Luther, Borgmann and Ellie McDaniel swimming.

In 11-12 boys Peyton Sieck was fourth (1:15.09) in the 100-yard freestyle, third (32.98) in the 50-yard freestyle and third in the 100-yard individual medley (1:33.55); Powell Sieck was second (43.96) in the 50-yard backstroke, fifth (44.76) and sixth in the 100-yard individual medley (1:38.88); and Austin Hahn was fourth (51.24) in the 50-yard breaststroke.

The 11-12 boys 200-yard freestyle relay was second (2:25.85) with Chase Johnson, Ryan Volk, Powell Sieck and Peyton Sieck swimming.

The 11-12 boys 200-yard medley relay was second (2:53.44) with Powell Sieck, Chase Johnson, House and Ryan Volk swimming.

The 11-12 mixed 200-yard medley relay was third (3:49.10) with Champ King, Leyton Cure, Peyton Sieck and Jackson Daise.

In 13-14 girls Kinsey Volk was sixth (34.97) in the 50-yard breaststroke.

In 13-14 boys Dusty Johnson was also third (1:19.76) in the 100-yard backstroke and third (1:28.47) in the 100-yard breaststroke; Hagan Hoss was second (1:08.35) in the 100-yard freestyle, second (28.74) in the 50-yard freestyle and third (1:26.43) in the 100-yard butterfly; and Simon Bassett was sixth (1:36.43) in the 100-yard breaststroke (1:36.43).

The 13-14 boys 200-yard freestyle relay was second (2:25.85) with Dusty Johnson, Simon Bassett, Hoss and House swimming.

The 13-14 boys 200-yard medley relay was second (2:44.23) with Dusty Johnson, Simon Bassett, Hoss and Austin Hahn swimming.

In 15-18 girls Brooke Lockhart was sixth (6:08.78) in the 400-yard freestyle and fifth (1:36.36) in the 100-yard backstroke (1:36.36); Rachel Horney was fourth (3:37.27); and Makayla Kennedy was sixth (1:40.54) in the 100-yard breaststroke.

In 15-18 boys Bonsall was also second (53.86) in the 100-yard freestyle and third (1:19.26) in the 100-yard backstroke; Zach Miller was also fifth (26.81) in the 50-yard freestyle and third (1:13.96) in the 100-yard breaststroke; Holton Witman was third (25.85) in the 50-yard freestyle, second (1:07.06) in the 100-yard butterfly and third (1:24.91) in the 100-yard breaststroke; Gerell Miller was sixth (26.82) in the 50-yard freestyle, second (1:14.50) in the 100-yard backstroke and fourth (1:25.26) in the 100-yard 100-yard breaststroke; Aaron Avelar was fourth (1:09.17) and sixth (1:33.06) in the 100-yard breaststroke; and Coy Johnson was sixth (1:35.96) in the 100-yard breaststroke.

The 15-18 mixed 200-yard medley B team was fifth (2:38.89) with Brooke Lockhart, Coy Johnson, Avelar and Kennedy swimming.

Others swimming were Alli Daise, Paetyn Barriclow and Savannah Bassett.

The Goodland Swim Club had 286 points for first, Colby Swim Club 233.5 points for second, Holyoke Swim Club 108 points for third, Wray Swim Club 187 points for fourth, Oberlin Swim Club 159 points for fifth, Burlington Swim Team 157.5 points for sixth, Oakley Swim Team 880 points for seventh and Flagler Swim Club 40 points for eighth.
