Areas sees some temporary heat relief

However, Bossert said, there is an index well in Thomas County which is measured every hour. It reached the lowest level ever recorded last week, three weeks earlier than its usual yearly low. The lack of rain means farmers are needing to pump more

"This doesn't mean farmers are wasting water," he said. "They just need more."

The December test will include more than 280 wells in northwest Kansas, 60 of those in Sherman County. The results will be released in March or April, and Bossert said he is not optimistic about what those tests will find. Last year southwest was the hardest hit, with an average water level dry, he said, but not as dry as the southwest or south central parts of the state.

United States – including all 105 in Kansas and those acres make up about 25 percent - are under drought disaster declarations, Congress has been slow to act on relief measures. On Thursday, the House of Representatives passed disaster relief for cattle and sheep producers, but the Senate didn't act on the bill, or the larger 2012 Farm Bill, before leaving for a five-week recess.

In the mean time, some measures are being taken. Last week several officials, including Gov. Sam Brownback and Rep. Tim Huelskamp requested – and got – the U.S. Department of Agriculture to lift haying restrictions on Conservation Reserve Program lands designated CP-25.CP-25 is a designation for rare and declining habitat.

While more than half the counties in the 45 percent of all CP-25 acres are in Kansas, of all CRP acres in our state, so this will provide some much needed relief for our farmers and ranchers. The drought is not getting any better, and I am pleased that USDA is responding."

According to the Agriculture Department, there are about 30,000 acres of CP-25 land in Sherman County. Those seeking to hay their land must obtain a revised conservation plan from their local Natural Resources Conservation Service office, may only cut once, may only cut half their field, and must have the having completed by Aug. 31.

Brownback, along with Sen. Pat Roberts, also got the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to stop releasing waters from three Kansas lakes on the Missouri River, allowing that water to stay in the state for drought relief.

decided to go ahead on his own.

Haiti and Uganda. He has raised enough money for 16,000 uniforms and has provided parents with five months of work.


