## Goodland city budget approved

The Goodland City Cll@nwkansas.com the $\$ 14$ million city budget at their meeting
Aug.6. MayorJohn Garcia opened a public hearing comment on the budget, but no one came to comment. Notice of the hearing had been published in the Goodland Star-News. During the budgeting process, the city commissioners made several changes to the budget the staff had prepared. The commission took out funding for sidewalk incentives

 0,000 in discretionary funds, which can be iven in donations to various organizations. City Manager Doug Gerber said it was theintent to keep taxes close to the same number of mills as last year. The budget will levy about 51.2 mills in taxes. Last year the city levied 49.2 mills. One mill is worth about $\$ 25,870$. There will be some variation when the official valuation numbers come out, Gerber said, as the city is currently working with estimates.
