• How big is your file size? In QuickBooks Pro, you will start to see problems as your file grows past 500,000 K. When it starts getting too big, you need to either shrink your data file or upgrade to Enterprise.

• How many DB File Fragments do you have? Below 10 is good. Close to 100 is not good and could indicate some serious problems.

• How big are your lists? Quick-Books has list limits and will start to function poorly if you pass those limits. To see the list limits, go to
