## Union Pacific steam locomotive stops in Sharon Springs



Steam locomotive number 844 stopped in Sharon Springs Thursday afternoon on its way to Colorado as a part of a celebration of Union Pacific's 150th anniversary. The train arrived over two hours late because the train was sidetracked in Grinnell while an east-bound coal train passed. The crowd of about 50 watched railroad employees grease the drive wheels and fuel up with diesel and water. The train steamed continued into Colorado on Friday morning. The train goes at a top speed of 49 miles an hour and steams through 12 gallons of water each mile. Locomotive 844 was finished in 1944, the last steam engine built by Union Pacific. It was used to pull passenger trains in the 1940s and freight in the 1950s.
