Commissioner looking for candidates Kansas Insurance

Commissioner Sandy Praeger is seeking applicants for five \$1,000 scholarships to be awarded to African-American students enrolled in

Kansas universities, colleges or community colleges during the 2013 spring semester.

These African-American Monumental Life Settlement Scholarships came from a nationwide legal settlement regarding premiums charged by Monumental Life Insurance Company to African-Americans. Commissioner Praeger advocated for establishing a scholarship program for Kansas African-American college students with the state's share of the settlement. The Kansas Legislature passed a law designating the funds for these scholarships.

The deadline for spring semester 2013 applications is Oct. 1, 2012. A scholarship committee of community volunteers and department staff members will award the scholar-

ships, which are renewable. An applicant for the scholarship
