Public television station to air Big 12 highlights

The new season of the weekly Scoreboard Show kicks off at 9:30 p.m. (Mountain Time) Friday, Aug. 31, on Smoky Hills Public Television, with an encore presentation at 9 a.m. (Mountain Time) Saturdays.
