sports. Cowboys fall to Norton in first home game

kbottrell@nwkansas.com The Goodland High School varsity football team took their first loss of the season Friday, falling 22-7 to a tough team from Norton.

Things looked good for the Cowboys in the first half. They held a 7-3 lead going into the locker room, but a resurgent Bluejay team came out strong in the second half. Norton took the lead and ran up the score while shutting Goodland down on defense.

Next action for the Cowboys will be at 7 p.m. Friday in Burlington.

The Cowboys won the toss and elected to return. Dax Ruhs made the return and several subsequent runs, but Goodland was stopped short of getting a first down and was forced to punt.

On defense, the Cowboys stopped the Bluejays with tackles from Cy Paxton, Colton Cooper and Garrett Taylor. Norton punted to Ruhs, who ran to the 28 yardline. Ruhs got the Cowbys to third down and four yards to go. A pass to Ruben Lazaro was not enough for the first down, but an offsides on the Blue jays gave the Cowboys the first down. On second and 10, quarterback Trey Teeter completed a pass to Taylen Smith, who got to the 33 yardline for another first down.

The Norton defense forced the Cowboys back to third and 12. Teeter went back for a pass, but the Bluejays kept up the pressure and his pass was incomplete. Goodland got called on a horse collar tackle personal foul, a 15 yard penalty.

Norton took over on Goodland's 14 yardline. With first and 10, the Blue jays tried for a touchdown pass, but Lazaro intercepted it in the endzone. However, the Cowboys were called on another personal foul, this time roughing the passer, which got the interception called back and gave Norton a first down.

The Bujays were stopped short of a touchdown with tackles from Gunner Helton and a sack by Tyler Gastineau. On fourth down with 15 to go, the Blue jays completed a field goal to take a 3-0 lead.

With 2:30 to go in the quarter, Norton kicked off and Paxton weaved his way through the Blujay special team all the way to the endzone for a touchdown. The Cowboys made the extra point to make it 7-3.

The Bluejays had the ball again with 2:09 left in the quarter. After several short gains, they were able to make a first down with a quarterback sneak just as the quarter ended.
