So, just exactly what is a Master Gardener, and why are they so busy? Master Gardeners received their special designation after completing several weeks of training from the special-

ists in the Extension Service, as well as utilizing the knowledge they have accumulated over the years in their own backyard. The Master Gardener program was created by the Extension Service to meet an enormous increase in requests from home gardeners for horticultural information. Fifty years ago, a


