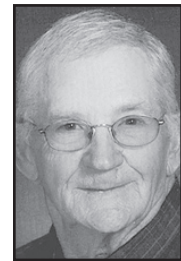
brothers, Harold Charles of Hoxie, John Charles of Fargo, N.D. and James (Joan) Charles of Leadville; and 10 grandchildren.

If your preference is set to "Enter Vendor Billing Information in POS", then you also need to enter the bill information when you receive the inventory. The bill will go to your QuickBooks Financial Pay Bills window. If your prefer-

ence is not set to "Enter Vendor Billing Information in POS," then your receiving voucher will go to QuickBooks Financial as an Item

Receipt. You then need to Enter Bills Against Inventory to turn that receipt into a bill to pay. Failure to do this correctly will result in weird balances and inventory problems.
