Bark splitting more common on locusts, maples

Bark splitting is more common on thin-barked and newly planted trees. This year, I usually see bark splitting on trees like maples and honey locust.

The most common cause of bark splitting is severe cold followed by rapid thawing during late winter to early spring. It can also be caused by dry weather followed by moisture.
