The Cowboys made small gains, then on third and seven they were stopped at the line of scrimmage, forcing them to punt. Ruhs made the tackle at the Holcomb 30 yard line.

The Longhorns made a first down on their opening play. After a fiveyard run, Holcomb picked up another first down. With 6:43 left in the first quarter, the Longhorns gained their third first down of the drive. The Longhorns drove to the Cowboys' 39 yard line, then turned it over on fourth down. Teeter was brought down in the backfield on the first play. With 1:26 left, Ruhs ran for a short gain. Teeter made an incomplete pass intended for Paxton. The Cowboys punted with less than a minute to go. Holcomb drove forward for a touchdown with 22 seconds left, making the score 14-0 at the half.

Gastineau kicked off to the Longhorns to open the second half and ended up making the tackle along with Cooper Slough. The Longhorns' four-minute drive carried them all the way to the one yard line, then they ran it in for a touchdown. Holcomb was now on top 21-0.

After Ruhs made the kickoff re-Cowboy offense again, allowing only six yards and forcing a punt.

This time, the Cowboys got the turnover with Slough forcing a fumble. Teeter nearly completed a pass to Gage Ihrig, but it was incomplete. Next he found Drew Dautel for a gain. Another incomplete pass brought up fourth down and a Goodland punt with 3:32 left in the third quarter.
