

# Girls golf team comes in third

The Goodland High School golf team came in third at Ulysses on Tuesday. The girls had a 413 team score. Ulysses won their home tournament with 396 while Syracuse took second with 404. Logan Perryman continued to do well, placing fifth with a 97. Emily Purvis and Jordan Knitig each shot a 105; Cortney Cowan, 106; Katie Hays, 107; and Kristi Stasser, 110. "All the girls had their opportunities to do better on scoring," said coach Connie Livengood. "Putting was a downfall today. I saw the girls on the top side of the green and not down below the pins; Ulysses's greens are far too hard to be on the high side of the hole."

Livengood said putting is something that can be corrected, and all of the girls had low-scoring holes as well which helped their overall score. "We know we have to narrow the gap next week, but I believe in this team and they can all cut more strokes off their game," she said. "It was a great day for golf today. Each week we have had someone come through for us. I have to commend the two freshman today (Perryman and Hays), as for not seeing the course before, they did a good job." The Cowgirls were scheduled to play at Syracuse Wednesday. Next action will be at 9 a.m. (Mountain Time) Saturday at Lakin.

# Mustangs continue undefeated streak

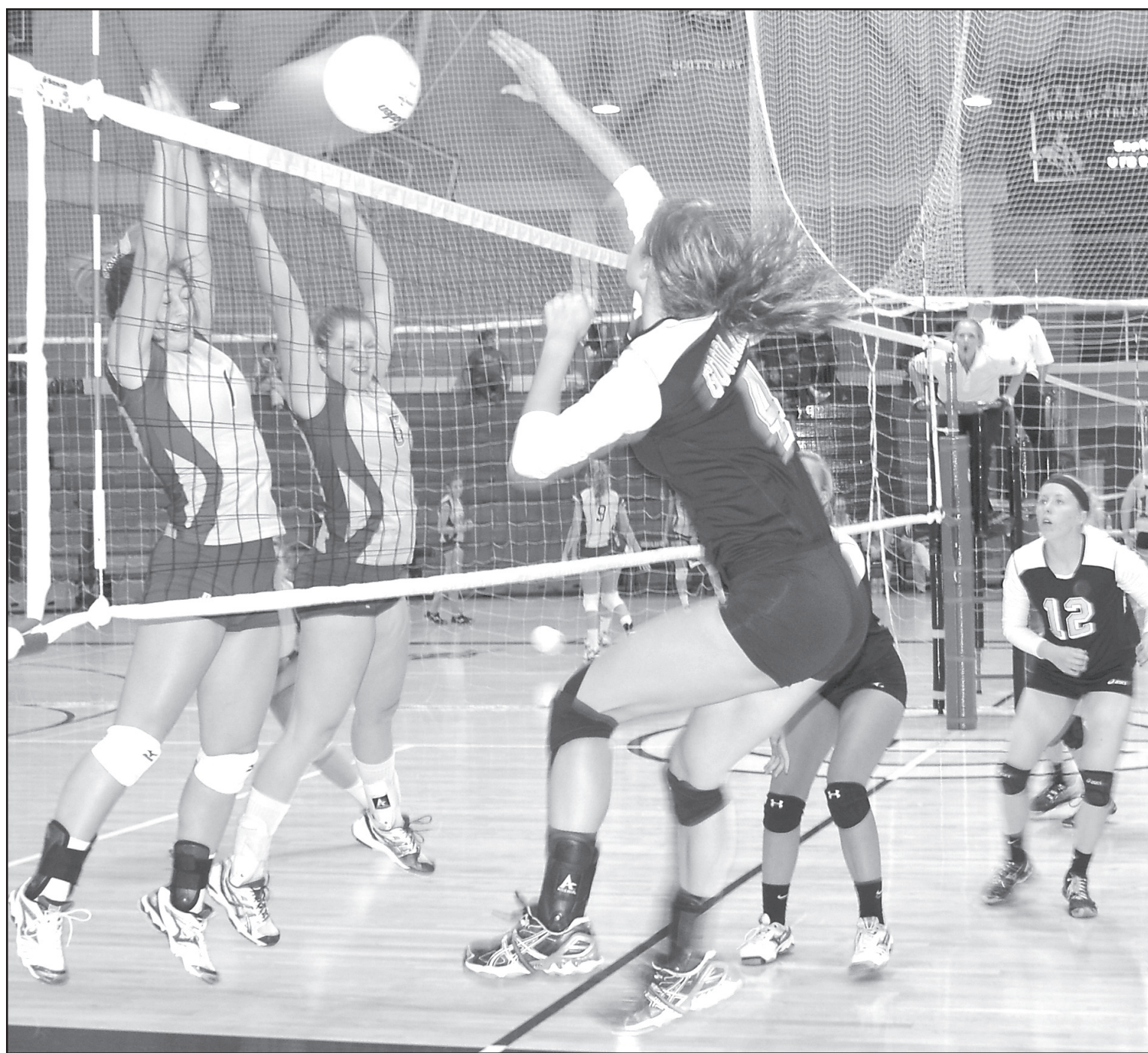
