After graduating from Atwood High School in 2003, Hagler said, he set his sights on optometry at Kansas State University, where he received a Bachelor of Science in biology. He then earned his doctorate and went on to get a certificate of advanced clinical competence with a residency in primary care.

"I completed a residency in primary care with an emphasis in ocular disease from the Jack C. Montgomery Veteran Affairs Medical Hospital," he said. "I got advanced clinical training in the management of various ocular diseases such as diabetic eye disease, macular degeneration and glaucoma, along with various other ocular conditions."

"I also received advanced training with traumatic brain injury patients as I helped veterans with visual problems after TBI's by assisting with visual balance, compensating for visual field loss, eye

movement problems and other eye related problems associated with these injuries."

Hagler said he enjoys all aspects of optometry, especially fitting contact lenses, working with children and low-vision rehabilitation.

"Low-vision rehabilitation involves helping people obtain more functional vision and an increased quality of life," he said, "by utilizing specialized optics, techniques and devices to enhance the remaining vision they do have. Reduced vision can be caused by macular degeneration, glaucoma or any other ocular disease."

"I have been at Vision Source for a month and a half," said Hagler. "The facility is state of the art, the staff is exceptionally talented and well

trained and it is just a great overall environment to provide patient care. I love it here."

Morrison said it has been refreshing to have a young mind to help with patients, especially with his expertise and passion for the field.

"Jordan is a welcome addition to Vision Source," he said.

Hagler is the son of Harlan and Margaret Hagler of Atwood. He said he enjoys spending time with his family: an older brother Jacob, his wife Linde and their two children, Emma and Bentley; and a sister Morgan Schweizer, her husband Bryan and their daughter Addie.

"It is great to be back around family," he added. "My hobbies are golfing, fishing, woodworking and farming, when I can."
