_sports Cowboys fall 48-13 to Ulysses

Despite holding on to a 6-0 lead in the first quarter, the Cowboys were unable to stop the Tigers running game and made several costly turnovers. They scored one last touchdown in the third quarter, but were unable to get any more good drives going while Ulysses continued to run up the score.

Next action for the Cowboys will be against Scott City at 6:30 p.m. Friday at Cowboy Stadium.

The Cowboys got off to a quick lead. Austin Hernandez made the kickoff return, then the Cowboys drove down to the eight yard line and Garrett Taylor ran it in for a touchdown. The extra point was blocked, but the Cowboys were up 6-0.

After a kickoff return to the 44 yard line, the Tigers made short gains and then a first down run to the 25. The Cowboys held them to fourth and one, but the Tigers converted the first down. Ulysses made more short gain, then Kolt Trachsel made a stop at the line of scrimmage to bring up fourth and six. An incomplete pass let the Cowboys take over at the nine yard line.

With three minutes left in the quarter, the Cowboys were unable to make any progress and had to punt. Dax Ruhs was injured on the play, but was able to walk off the field and returned later in the game.

The Tigers got the ball on the 31 yard line. A runner ran around the right side and was pushed out of bounds at the 21, but a holding call took them back to first and 25. After a gain of seven and an incomplete pass, the Tigers ran for a first down. With 15 seconds left, Ulysses was called for holding. An incomplete pass ended the quarter.

The Tigers turned the ball over on downs at the 25 yard line to open the second quarter. Gage Ihrig made a gain of six. Taylor ran up the middle for three yards, but Ihrig was stopped at line, forcing a punt.

With 9:45 left in the half, the Tigers took over at the 34 yard line. Ulysses picked up a first down. A gain of six put the ball on the 50 yard line. A run for four yards put the Tigers

The Tigers drove to the endzone and scored, making it 33-13.
