Heat and drought hurts fir trees

The heat and drought this year has been very tough on trees; especially some of the evergreens. Spruce, fir and pine are not well adapted to Kansas conditions, and high stress years like this one can lead to decline and death. However, there are natural conditions that can look like the tree is dying that actually are not harmful.

How can you tell, the differ-

If the needles are browning just on the inside of the tree, but the needles farthest out on the branches remain green, the tree is going through natural needle drop. Natural needle drop does not harm the health of the tree and is a normal process as two-and three-year-old needles are shed.
