schools are at the substitution phase, where they use technology as a replacement for older things like books or overhead projectors. Where they should strive to go, he said, is first to augment their teaching using technology, and eventually redesign the curriculum around it to do things they couldn't do before.

The top reasons most schools are still in the substitution phase are lack of money, lack of training and fear. Education is changing, Senstock said, and teachers are no longer the content

experts. Information can be readily looked up, and teachers have to become attuned to that, rather than providing ready-made knowledge.

'But we've been teaching with ready-made knowledge and using the same tools for 60 years," he said. "Students learn in a completely different way now."

Students are taking ownership of their own learning, he said. "Never has there been a time when we more

have to question our brick and mortar institutions," he said.

The challenge then becomes how to get stu-

dents to want to come to a campus, he said. The iPad program at Northwest Tech has accomcollege to more than double its enrollment in four years, he said.
