

# Freshman runner places 18th at state

Goodland High School freshman Lacie Siruta medaled at the Class 4A State Cross Country Competition on Saturday in Wamego.

Siruta finished in 16 minutes and 9.5 seconds, earning her an 18th place finish out of 51 runners.

Coach James Myers said it was an impressive finish on a tough, hilly course.

"It was a very physical race with kids fighting for position on the tight corners," he said.

The Topeka Hayden team was the state champion, while Katren Reinbolt of Fort Scott finished first with a time of 14:50.2. Fellow Western Kansas Liberty League member Ulysses placed 10th as a team and had a runner finish sixth. The only other 4A runner from northwest Kansas, Colby's Andrea Browne, finished 33rd with 16:26.2.

Ben Baird ran the course in 18 minutes, 3.30 seconds, taking 12th. Layton Werth finished in 18th place with a time of 18:22.90.

They both ran their personal best times of the season. Baird cut 22 seconds off his previous best and Werth

cut 38 seconds from his.

Also placing in the top 20 from western Kansas were three boys from Greeley County and two from Victoria.

From Tribune, Troy Wineinger took third; Miguel Trejo eighth; and Sergio Trejo 14th. From Victoria, Jublain Wohler, 11th, and Isaac Dreiling, 20th. There were 95 runners.
