Mavericks win twice at Colby tournament

The Northwest Kansas Technical College men's basketball team gave fans a reason to cheer this weekend as they scored the first wins in the program's history at the Colby Ambassador Classic.

Northwest Tech had come into the tournament 0-3, having lost close games to Pratt Community College, Barton Community College and Dodge City Community College in the first week of November. The Mavericks got their first win of the season against Colorado Northwestern in their first game of the tournament.

The Mavericks scored the first five points of the game and then traded blows with the Spartans. They were trailing 34-31 at the half, then took the lead by scoring on three straight turnovers. They held on for a 75-69 win.

The Mavericks got an even bigger win Friday evening, knocking off the Tabor College Bluejays 77-47.

The Bluejays scored the first points, but the Mavericks took over, leading for the remainder of the first half. They led by as many as 15 and finished the half ahead. In the second half, Walden fouled out, but that didn't stop the Mavericks from amassing a 30 point lead by the time the buzzer sounded.

Gian Clavell led the team with 19 points, followed closely by Talan Whitaker with 18. Jeffrey Burgos put in 13 points; Marcus Walden,

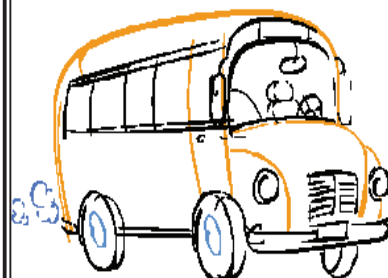
8; Juan Ortiz, 6; Markees Walker, 4; Dustin Chewiwi, 3; and Kayman Garrett and Lamar Britton each had 2.

In the Mavericks' final game of the tournament, they lost by one point, 96-95, to Colby in overtime. Northwest Tech led most of the way, going up by as much as 19, but Colby rallied and won with a last-second three-pointer.

The Mavericks finished the tournament with a 2-1 record.

The men's team is scheduled to play at 5 p.m. today against Frank Phillips College in Borger, Texas, and will play Friday and Saturday at the Brown Mackie Classic in Salina. The first home game is scheduled for 7 p.m. next Tuesday against Colby Community College.
