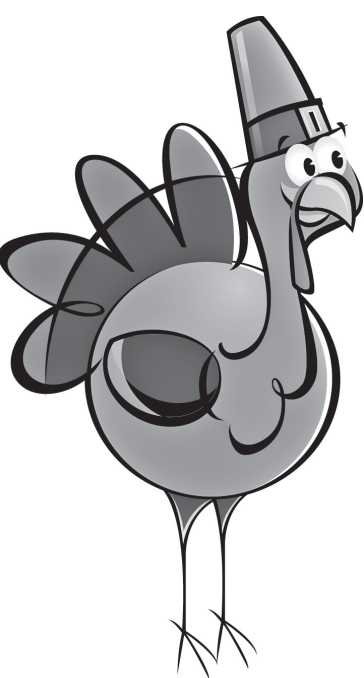


How to cook a turkey...
