Compost piles need to be turned monthly

Compost piles should be turned about once per month even during the winter months. This will insure the composting process continues and that all

to compost.

materials are equally composted. A compost pile is "turned' when uncomposted material is moved from the sides and tops of the pile to the center where it provides "fuel" for the microorganisms that break it

down. This is the time of year when

there are lots of materials available

Remember that the compost needs to be kept moist so that the bacteria and fungi can break down

the raw materials. Use a sprinkler to soak through the pile to the center. Allow the pile to drain. The goal is for the pile to remain moist; not waterlogged.
