Patrol issues holiday incident report

The Kansas Highway Patrol worked two fatal crashes, with two fatalities, during the Thanksgiving weekend holiday reporting period, which ran from 6 p.m. last Wednesday through midnight Sunday.

One of the fatal crashes was alcohol-related. During the same reporting period last year, there were no fatalities.

Here are other figures collected by the Patrol, compared to last year.

- Driving under the influence-related crashes: 5 vs. 3.
- Driving under the influence-

related fatalities: 1 vs. 0.

• Driving under the influence arrests: 25 vs. 24.

• Speed citations: 1,568 vs. 1,400.

• Speed warnings: 1,352 vs. 1,245.

• Adult seatbelt citations: 349 vs. 342.

• Adult seatbelt warnings: 58

vs. 118.

• Teen seatbelt citations: 12 vs. 9.

• Teen seatbelt warnings: 1 vs. 2.

• Child restraint citations: 39 vs. 39.

• Child restraint warnings: 4 vs. 7.

• Motorists assisted: 1,307 vs. 1,426.
