Not all firewood is equal; some produces more heat

Not all firewood is created equal. Some species of trees are able to produce much more heat per cord of wood. A cord is the amount of wood in a well-stacked woodpile measuring four feet wide by eight feet long by four feet high. Following are heat values (in million BTU's) per cord for various species of tree. The better the wood is, the higher the value.
