Goodland Events Team wants event ideas at meeting Thursday

Got an event you’d like to see happen in Goodland? The Goodland Events Team will hold a public brainstorming session at 6 p.m. Thursday at the library.

The Goodland Events Team, or GET, is an all-volunteer organization sponsored by the city of Goodland. Current team members include city employees Lexi Quiroz, Karen Anderson and Crystal Van Vleet, who are donating their time

outside of office hours. Anderson said the team gets no tax money and relies on volunteers and partnering with other organizations.

“If someone has a good idea,” she said, “we can find a good partner to fit that idea.”

Quiroz said the idea to form a group came out of a conversation about a lack of things to do, especially for young people. Quiroz said she has recently moved to Goodland from a larger city and expected there to be more events.

“We wanted to help get more things going,” she said. “We want to keep people over-scheduled.”

For their first event, the team partnered with the Goodland Area Chamber of Commerce for a Young Professionals get-together at the museum in May. Quiroz said they got a good response and are planning more Young Professionals events.

Man arrested after home searched

A 40-year-old man was arrested last week on charges of sexual exploitation of a child after a search of a Goodland home by the Sherman County Sheriff’s Office.

Sherman County Sheriff Burton Pianalto issued a release Friday, saying his office had executed a search warrant at 419 W.16th on Thursday. The warrant resulted in the arrest of Michael Robben on charges with sexual exploitation of a child. A bond of \$250,000 has been set by the Sherman County

District Court.

The release said the investigation is ongoing and came about because a concerned citizen brought to the attention to law enforcement a computer that may contain child pornography.

The Sheriff’s Office has requested that anyone with information on the case contact the Sherman County Sheriff Office at 890-4835. Pianalto noted that anyone accused of a crime is presumed innocent until proven guilty.

Stormy weekend

Golf-ball sized hail fell in Goodland on Saturday as three severe thunderstorms rolled through. Monday afternoon saw more storms in southern Sherman County. Tornado warnings were issued, and a small landspout tornado was observed just over the Colorado border. The storms dropped little in the way of sustained moisture, with only about 36 hundredths recorded by the National Weather Service.

Flood insurance rates to increase

Kansans evaluating their flood insurance needs should be aware of upcoming rate increases for new and renewal policies, according to Sandy Praeger, Commissioner of Insurance.

The rate increases are part of provisions passed by Congress as part of the Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012.

Floods — or an excess of water (or mud) on normally dry land — are not covered by a typical homeowners or renters policy. Most homes may be eligible for coverage under the National Flood Insurance Program. The program offers flood insurance policies, through local insurance agents, for homeowners or renters in communities that participate in the federal program.

"Consumers should be aware there is a 30-day waiting period after the purchase of a flood insurance policy before the coverage goes into effect," Commissioner Praeger said, "so Kansans should take that into consideration when

determining if and when to purchase coverage."

The new federal legislation extends the program until Sept. 30, 2017. It includes phasing out subsidies on properties with repetitive losses, allowing coverage for multifamily properties and minimum deductibles for flood claims. The typical policy premium is approximately \$500 per year, according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), which oversees the flood insurance.

Although the Kansas Insurance Department can answer basic questions about flood insurance through its Consumer Assistance Hotline, the NFIP is a federal program that has its own website, www.floodsmart.gov. Kansas consumers can also call the FEMA Region VII office at (816) 283- 7980.

Brown Recluse bites reported

The Sherman County Health Department has received notification of several brown recluse spider bites in the area. This is the time of year this spider starts mating. They are nocturnal and begin to come out an hour or two after dark to hunt for food. They prefer warm dry locations such as in bedding, stacks of clothes, shoes, under furniture and in closets to name but a few. The brown recluse spider is about .5 inches in length and has a dark violin-shaped mark on the combined head and midsection of their body.

The spider bite doesn't always hurt right away. You may not know you have been bitten until other symptoms appear. Symptoms include:

- Reddened skin that may be followed by a blister that forms at the bite site.
- Mild to intense pain and itching for two to eight hours following the bite.
- An open sore that develops a

week or more following the bite that may take months to heal.

Some people have a severe, systemic (whole body) reaction to the brown recluse spider bite, including fever and chills, skin rash all over body, nausea or vomiting and joint pain.

If you think you have been bitten by a brown recluse spider remain calm. Too much excitement or movement will increase the flow of venom into the blood. Apply a cool, wet cloth to the bite or cover the bite with a cloth and apply an ice bag to the bite. Do not apply a tourniquet as it may cause more harm than good.

A brown recluse spider bite can be serious and may require immediate medical care. Call your medical provider immediately if you have severe symptoms throughout.

Press freedom must be preserved

The secret seizure of Associated Press phone records by the Justice Department investigating an alleged leak of top-secret information represents a dangerous abuse of government power. In effect, the AP has been put on notice that if it persists in reporting stories the administration does not approve of, the government can destroy its credibility and scare its sources off. The results could be a near end to investigative reporting in Washington, where nearly everything the government does is secret, especially the bad stuff. Who, after all, is going to call an AP reporter and give him or her background information on a story – any story – when only the top guys in any agency are “authorized” to speak to the press? And they only recite the administration line?

This is not about politics. Administrations of both parties have been guilty of abusing the Constitution. Remember Dick Nixon and his enemies list? The whole Watergate coverup? But the Obama administration has been deep into repression of the press. Despite the fact that the president himself last week renewed his support of a reporters’ shield law which would have prevented this fiasco, his administration still defends the subpoena used to get reporters’ phone records.

This act has a particularly chilling effect on news gathering because just the thought that the FBI might be listening will keep a lot of mid-level bureaucrats from blowing the whistle on their bosses. And that’s how the public finds out about a lot of government misbehavior.

Worst yet, the fear will dry up calls to a lot of other reporters. Who knows how many phones might be tapped in Washington, how many offices might be bugged? It’s not just that, or course. This is the same administration that allowed the Internal Revenue Service to hold up tax-exempt status for tea party-related groups that otherwise qualified just because they were conservative.

It’s an administration, and a Justice Department, grounded in the Chicago-style politics its leader learned at the knee of the Dailey family, who helped him get where he is and shared in federal appointments, influence and other spoils after his election. There’s nothing special about this bunch. No dreamers, no Camelot. Just politics, not as usual, but the worst kind.

Tracing the calls on hundreds of phone lines, checking on everyone a reporter might have talked with in a slew of AP offices, the government showed it can flex its muscle at will. This intrusion surely underlines the need for a strong federal shield law, one that will protect reporters’ sources, allow courts to ferret out true danger to national security and keep government goons at bay.

It’s not that the Obama gang is the enemy. They’re just playing the game, even though they should know better. A security apparat that wants every tighter control over every aspect of American life is to blame. Politicians in both parties play the game. We all need laws to defend us, and reporters in particular, because we depend on them to tell us what our government is up to. We need them to be free and unfettered in that quest. – Steve Haynes

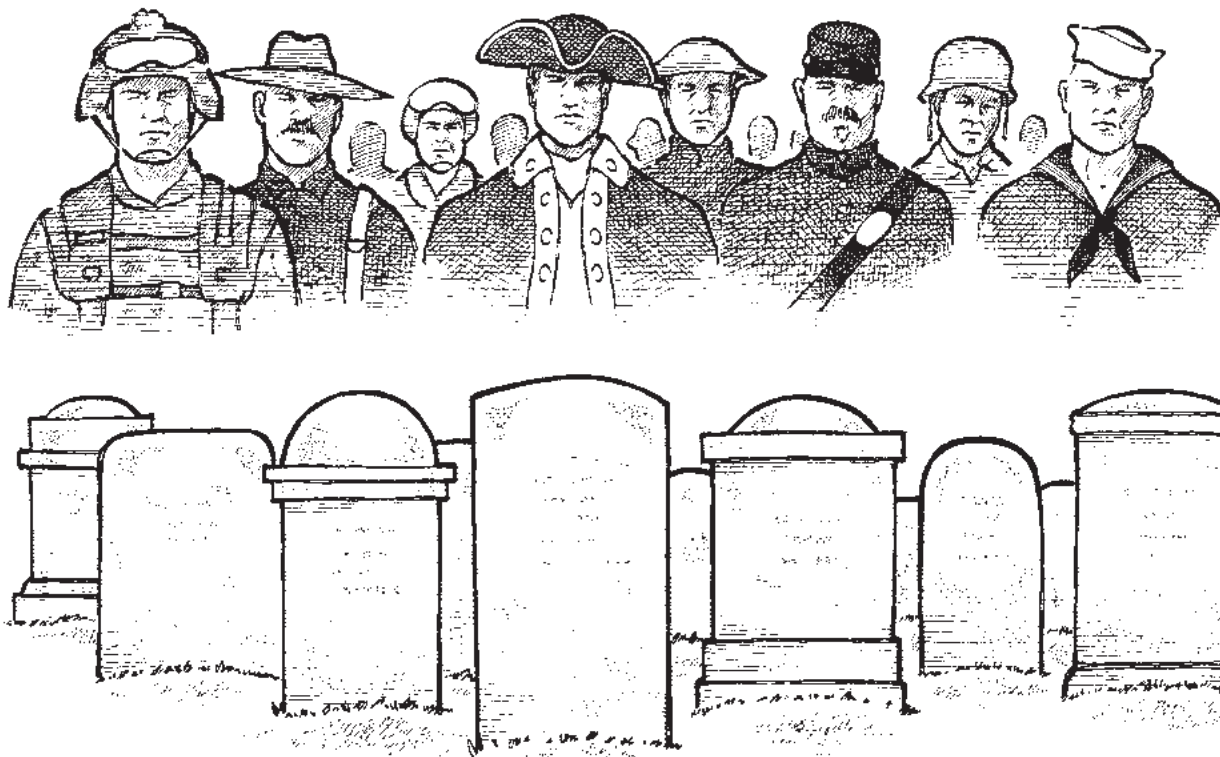

Guantanamo Bay a global sore point

Mention Guantanamo Bay today and the first thing you hear is concern about the many detainees who are on a hunger strike and those who are being force fed by military guards.

I was a Navy Journalist (JO3) stationed at Guantanamo Naval Station (GTMO) in 1970-71 and find the changes in the past decades have certainly tarnished the view I had for those 13 months. When I tell anyone I was stationed at GTMO, I have to quickly say it was long before the prison.

I listened to President Barack Obama’s speech on Thursday in which he tried to spell out changes and another attempt to close the prison at GTMO. I hope the combination of the President’s efforts and a change of attitude in Congress will allow our country to close this prison. The prison is a symbol of a horrible chapter of American injustice in the treatment of detainees who have been in this limbo prison for more than a decade.

The timing of Obama’s speech was perfect as I had recently finished a book “Guantanamo: an American History,” written by Jonathan M. Hansen, and published in 2011. His book details the history of Guantanamo Bay going back to the earliest days in how the island of Cuba was formed and the first sighting of the wide harbor by Columbus on his second voyage about 1494. Hansen details the early years when America took control of the base during the Spanish-American War in 1898, and how it has changed through the more than 100 years of Naval control.

Thinking about my short time at GTMO I realized I was there in a quiet period between the takeover of Cuba by Fidel Castro and the

building of the camps for Haitian and Cuban refugees in the late 70s to the 90s. The prison was first constructed in 2002 under the Bush administration.

While on the base in 1970 all personnel were trained as part of the “Ground Defense Force,” in case Castro ever decided to attack. I toured the fence line around the base and could see the Cuban guards watching us through their binoculars as we looked out at them. I knew during that year about 1,000 Cubans climbed the fence or came through the opening in the bay between the lower larger bay and the smaller bay north of the base where Caimanera and Boqueron, the Cuban towns, were located. I got to know some of the self-exiled Cubans who lived and worked on the base, and a few of the Cubans who walked into the base each day and returned to their Cuban homes at night. Recently the last two of these workers retired ending this routine connection between the base and the surrounding country. When I was there about 400 workers came in every day.

I have thought back on my time at the base probably more fondly than most, but I was in a somewhat unique situation where I had more access and connection with different parts of the base and those living there. When first there I helped finish and setup the first enlisted and

bachelor officer quarters that replaced the old open barracks dating back to before World War II. Looking at aerial photos some of those buildings appear to be in use today.

I thought about the Cubans risking their lives to escape and how similar to the many Germans who found ways to circumvent the Berlin Wall. As a European symbol of tyranny the wall was torn down at the end of the 80s. I listen to those who want to “seal” our borders with the same kind of walls and fences, and wonder what they would do to escape if they were on the other side of these barriers. While I was at GTMO Castro built watch towers, tank traps, minefields and thousands of feet of barbed wire around the outside of the base to try to eliminate those escaping. As with any of these barriers you might slow the number of people seeking to escape, but their indomitable spirit will not keep them from trying.

What we should have learned from these and other examples, is it is important for our country to help those who feel a need to escape to find hope and a reason to stay in their own country. We need to fix our immigration system, and allow those who want to come here legally have a reasonable expectation of access and a feeling we will welcome them as our ancestors were welcomed in the nearly 400 years since the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock.

I continue to feel good about my time at GTMO, but today I know my view was sort of through rose-colored glasses. I am glad I was there, and am grateful I missed all the terrible developments forced on the base in the decades since I returned to my civilian life.

The blood flowing in the tubing across your arm feels real weird when you are donating during the local bloodmobile. It’s warm, body temperature. Weird.

It feels even stranger when its coming out of a bag on a pole and flowing back into your system. It’s cool, refrigerated. Odd.

I’ve been donating blood for more than 40 years. I started in college when my roommate was in charge of the Bloodmobile drive.

In Kansas City, I was on their list of willing donors, people the blood bank could call on whenever they needed my type. And since my type is O positive. I got a lot of calls.

It was also something I could do for others that cost me almost nothing, and since I had little money, that was good.

I donated less frequently when we lived in Colorado, as the bloodmobile didn’t come to our little town in the mountains very often, and it was a long way to the next town, especially when you have three little kids.

Back in Kansas in the early 1990s, I was able to start giving more often, and I always felt it was one of the things you do to help out your fellow man and your community. And I was never alone in those chairs. There were lots of other willing donors stretching their arms out. You could always tell when high school got out and the seniors arrived to donate.

Of course, we all smiled when a football player keeled over and the 115-pound grandmother took it all in stride. But, we all

came. We all gave.

I really never thought of it as paying something forward. But, that’s how it turned out for me.

I got a bad stomach bug while I was in Georgia. So bad I didn’t go near my daughter and her new baby for most of the week. Apparently that lit the fuse on a long-standing problem, which really take off. I was losing my blood, at first a little at a time, then faster and faster.

By the time I got home, I was really tired. I couldn’t walk up the stairs without resting, and I had an almost constant pounding in my head, like an overhead fan with a bad bearing.

I knew I was anemic, and decided it was time to see the doctor. Although I had been taking iron pills, I figured a stronger dose might be in order. I had things to do, and I was having a hard time getting them done.

My doctor ordered a blood test and after

checking the results, announced that I was the most anemic person he had seen in more than a year. He had me wheeled over to the hospital, where they put me on an IV while cross matching my blood. Over the next 15 hours, I got six pints. Since my research tells me that the human body holds about 10, I think that means I was really low.

They told me that my hemoglobin, the cells that carry oxygen to the body, was at 4.8 grams per decaliter of blood. The average, healthy female has a count of 12 to 15. In fact, one of the nurses told me that under five is considered inconsistent with life. Well, I’m glad I didn’t know that beforehand.

Steve keeps saying that I was three quarts low and my son noted that it looked like I’d had an oil change.

Whichever it was, I’m back to work and feeling fine despite a few jokes about becoming a vampire or a zombie. Or a vampire zombie.

They’re still going to make me do some really unfun tests, but I want to personally thank all those grandmother, football players, farmers and high school teachers who trotted down to the Gateway on Wednesday to give blood.

I wasn’t with them this time. You never know when it’ll be payback time.

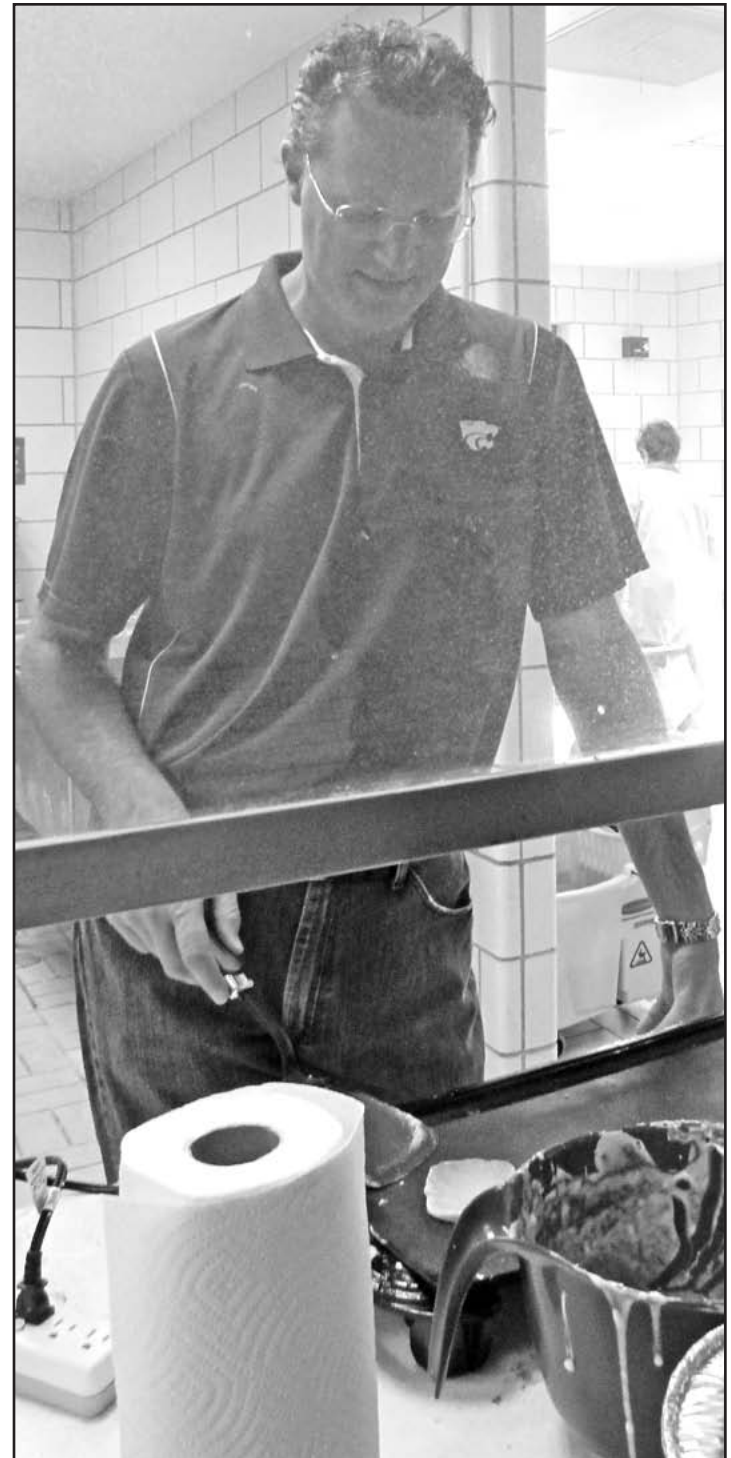

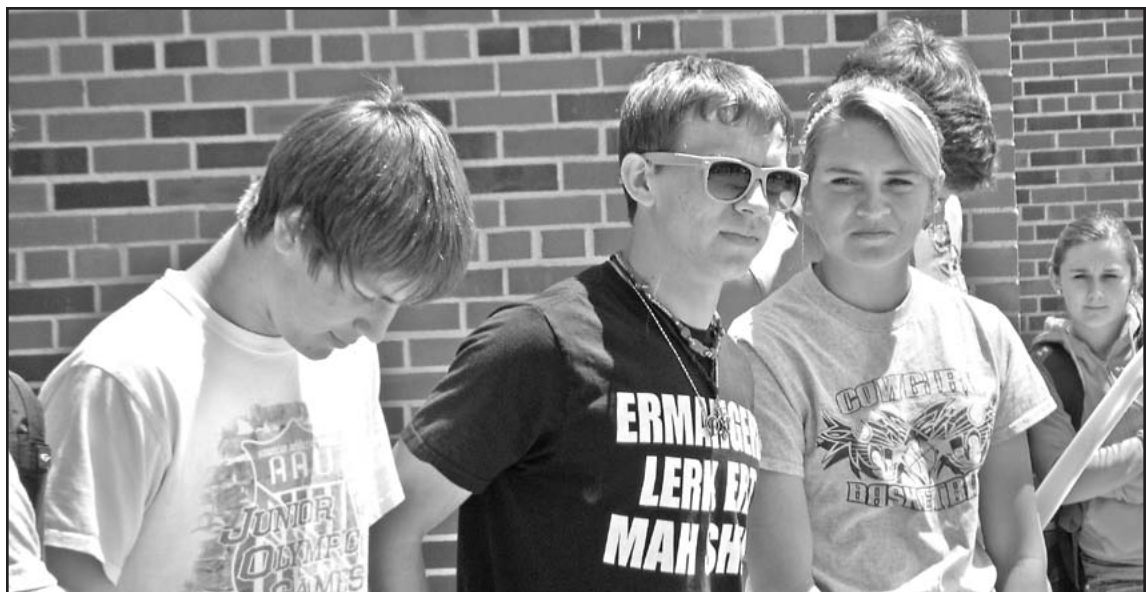
