‘Gustnado’ sightings in Saturday storms

Weather spotters in Cheyenne County reported what may or may not have been tornados during a severe thunderstorm on Saturday.

Meteorologist Jerry Killingsworth said the National Weather Service is leaning toward designating the incidents as "gustnados" rather than tornados. Gustnados form on the leading edge of a thunderstorm. The air in front of the

storm can spin up, he said, often several hundred feet in the air, and while they look similar, they are technically not tornados. Gustnados are typically brief and not severe.

The gustnados were reported about five miles south east of wheeler and southwest of Bird City about 2:45 p.m. Killingsworth said the Weather Service has not had any reports of damage so far.

Killingsworth said the Weather Service was closely monitoring the

storm, but it was kicking up a lot of dust which, along with the rain, hampered visibility. The service did issue several tornado warnings for southern Cheyenne County and northern Sherman County.

Aside from the gustnados, the main impact of the storm was straight-line winds, which were reported to be in excess of 60 mph. There were also reports of isolated hail up to one inch in diameter.

There were several other storms

around the area that afternoon. Winds up to 60 mph were reported in Wallace, Thomas and Logan counties. Later in the evening a tornado warning was issued for northeastern Logan County and south central Thomas County.

The service is predicting a clear day today with a high temperature of 88 and getting hotter the rest of the week. It is currently predicting a chance of thunderstorms Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

About 5 p.m. Friday, Gibson and another driver were involved in an accident on the track. Two Sherman County ambulances were called to the scene. One driver was reportedly taken to Goodland Regional Medical Center with a head injury. It was learned later that Gibson had died of his injuries.

The afternoon hot laps were cancelled, but the main evening races went forward as planned.

Gibson, of Loveland, Colo., was a veteran motorcycle racer who had competed on tracks in Kansas for more than 30 years. Gibson was also the founder of the Diversified Body and Paint Shop in Denver in 1989. The business recently celebrated its 25th anniversary.

Department seeks public input on data

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is seeking public input concerning a proposal to provide more information to the public about the amount of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program benefits used by participants at individual grocery stores and retailers. The department's goal is to provide as much transparency as possible on retailer data within the limits of the law. In doing so, the department will consider input from a wide variety of stakeholders through a request for information published today in the Federal Register. The request for information seeks public comment on several questions related to the transparency of program retailer redemption information.

"Our goal is to provide more transparency so that people can have access to basic information about the amount of SNAP benefits that individual grocery stores and retailers are redeeming," Agriculture Under Secretary Kevin Concanon said. "We hope that this public comment period will be informative as to how we can do that in the most thoughtful and appropriate way possible."

The information is part of the Obama administration's ongoing effort to make government more open and accountable and increase transparency. Since 1978, the agriculture department has interpreted federal law as protecting SNAP retailer redemption information. A South Dakota newspaper successfully challenged that view and the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit ultimately agreed, ruling in favor of the newspaper. The ruling was limited to the interpretation of Section 9(c) of the Food and Nutri-

tion Act and did not address whether redemption data constitutes "trade secrets, [or] commercial or financial information obtained from a person [that is] privileged or confidential" which would still be protected from disclosure through Exemption 4 of the Freedom of Information Act.

The agriculture department is now considering whether this redemption data constitutes confidential business information under Freedom of Information Act. To make a determination, the department is required to seek feedback from affected stakeholders, specifically nutrition program retailers, on whether annual aggregate redemption data from individual stores is confidential under the act. Additionally, the department is considering what, if any, adjustments should be made to nutrition program regulations regarding the release of retailer transaction data in the future based on input from the public. Comments may be submitted through the Federal Register until Sept. 8.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program is the nation's first line of defense against hunger - helps put food on the table for millions of low income families and individuals every month. As the largest of the department's 15 nutrition assistance programs, it has never been more critical to the fight against hunger. The program is a vital supplement to the monthly food budget of more than 46 million low-income individuals. Nearly half of participants are children, nine percent are over 60 and more than 40 percent of recipients live in households with earnings.

Safety specialist explains labels

So, we're getting pretty savvy about checking food labels for fat, calories and fiber, but labels of a different sort, such as "sell by" and "use by" can leave us guessing about whether to keep or toss food.

"The current system of food product dating in the U.S. can be confusing, and is not necessarily related to food safety," said Kansas State University assistant professor, Londa Nwadike.

Shoppers sometimes shy away from buying a product because the "sell by" or "use by" date is close by. Or they buy it but don't use it right away, only to notice later that the "sell by" date has come and gone. If unsure whether it's safe to eat, the food is thrown away – sometimes unnecessarily, said Nwadike, who is a consumer food safety specialist for Kansas State Research and Extension and the University of Missouri.

She gave tips to keep shoppers safe and cut food waste to a minimum.

1) Infant formula is the only food product on which expiration dates are federally regulated. Don't buy or use baby formula after its "use-by" date, for both safety and nutritional reasons.

2) Some states do require dating of some foods, but other than infant formula, there is no regulated food dating system across the U.S. Some groups have made recommendations to standardize the system used, but at this time, dates are put on products in a variety of ways. The U.S. Department of Agriculture provides definitions for some terms used on food product labels:

- "Sell by" date: Tells the store how long to display the product for sale. You should buy the product before that date.
- "Best if used by (or before)" date: Recommended for best flavor or quality. It is not a purchase or safety date.
- "Use by" date: The last date recommended by the manufacturer for the use of the product while at peak quality.

Food safety tips at farmers markets

Farmers markets are a great place to buy healthy local produce and other foods, meet and support local farmers, and enjoy shopping in a fun environment. But shoppers should also pay attention to food safety when buying and using foods from farmers markets, says a University of Missouri Extension food safety specialist.

"Farmers markets are great and I encourage people to shop at them, but the experience level of the vendors with food safety practices may vary greatly," says Londa Nwadike, extension consumer food safety specialist for University of Missouri and Kansas State University.

"The consumer needs to take a bit more active role in deciding what products to buy and from which vendors," she says.

Nwadike notes that supermarkets normally have strict food safety inspection and control systems in place to protect their brand. They also have the advantage of a temperature-controlled environment.

"At a farmers market, the same food safety systems may not be in place," she says. "At some farmers markets, the manager is very actively encouraging food safety, but at others the managers are volunteers and may not have time to check on food safety."

Farmers markets do have one food safety advantage, she says. "You can ask the vendors questions about their food safety practices, which you usually can't do at a supermarket."

Nwadike recommends looking for clues that can tell you about the vendor's food safety practices. Surfaces and any knives or other utensils should be clean. Workers should have clean hands and clothing. Look for a hand-washing station in the booth, particularly in booths selling prepared foods or offering samples.

food quality, rather than safety, Nwadike said. However, they can give a general idea of how long the food has been in the market.

3) Many canned foods are required to have a packing code which enables manufacturers to rotate their stock and locate their products in the event of a recall. These codes are not meant for consumers to interpret as use-by dates (unless they are clearly marked as a "use-by" date).

4) The most important thing consumers can do to impact the length of time they can safely keep and use food is to handle it properly. This includes:

- If perishable, take the food home immediately after purchase and refrigerate it (at 40°F or below) within at least two hours. Freeze it if you can't use it within recommended safe refrigerated storage times. Once a perishable product is frozen, microbial growth stops, so it will be as safe as it was when it went into the freezer.
- Store foods in the cupboard, refrigerator or freezer at the proper temperature and length of time. Do not leave perishable foods at room temperature more than two hours. If you know that a carton of milk has been sitting on the counter more than three hours, throw it out regardless of what date is on the container.
- If the product has a "use-by" date on the package, follow that date to determine when to use it.
- Follow the handling and preparation instructions on the product label.
- Avoid cross-contamination and ensure proper sanitation.
- If the product has visible mold, off odors, the can is bulging or other similar signs, this spoilage may be a sign that dangerous microorganisms are present. With such products, use the "If in doubt, throw it out" rule.

5) Be extra cautious with food to be consumed by vulnerable people such as young children, the elderly, pregnant women, and immune-compromised.

More tips while shopping:

- Fresh produce should be clean, look fresh, have no cuts or nicks, and be displayed off the ground or floor.
- Cut or peeled produce should be on or surrounded by ice and look fresh and cold.
- Meat, eggs and cheeses should be in a cooler or on ice. Packages must feel cold. Egg cartons should be clean and eggs not cracked.
- Milk should be pasteurized for safety. Ask vendor to confirm.
- Canned fruits and vegetables should be processed appropriately for the type of product. Ask vendor how they were handled and prepared.
- Hot prepared foods should have a lid and be warm enough that you can see steam rising from the pan. Preferably, you should see vendors using a thermometer to check food temperature.

You also want to make sure your food stays safe on the way home:

- Keep raw meat separate from other foods.
- Make the market your last stop before going home.
- Use a cooler or insulated bags, especially if it takes more than an hour to get home.

Benefits found in fall, winter burns

Kansas State University researchers have completed a 20-year study that looks at the consequences of burning Flint Hills prairie at different times of the year. It finds that burning outside of the current late spring time frame has no measurable negative consequences for the prairie and, in fact, may have multiple benefits.

The study was conducted by Gene Towne, research associate and the Konza Prairie Biological Station fire chief, and Joseph Craine, research assistant professor, both in the Division of Biology. They recently published the study, "Ecological consequences of shifting the timing of burning tallgrass prairie," in the peer-reviewed scientific journal "Plos One". The study is the most comprehensive on seasonal burning ever conducted.

The Flint Hills are 82,000 square miles of unplowed tall grass prairie that stretch from eastern Kansas to north-central Oklahoma. The region is an important area for grazing cattle. In a typical year, ranchers annually burn thousands of acres of grassland to reduce the abundance of undesirable trees and shrubs

while promoting nutritionally rich grass for that summer's grazing.

Currently, burning of Flint Hills prairie is typically concentrated in late April. The time frame stems from research conducted more than 40 years ago.

"Burning in the Flint Hills has been a scientific and political issue for at least 80 years," Craine said. "Burning the prairie is ecologically important to Kansas grasslands and to ranchers in the region. But when everybody burns at the same time, it becomes a source of contention for cities downwind of the smoke and creates legal issues when clean air standards are exceeded."

The study uses 20 years' worth of burning data collected at the university's Konza Prairie Biological Station. In 1994 large, replicated watersheds of the native prairie were set aside. Over a 20-year period, each section was burned annually either in the fall, winter or spring. This enabled researchers to look at what effect burning during a particular season had on the vegetation long-term.

They found that when the prairie is burned in fall or winter, grass

composition and production was not negatively affected compared to burning in the spring.

"This research indicates that ranchers do not have to restrict their pasture burning to only late April," Towne said. "Burning earlier in the season offers increased flexibility in ensuring that the pasture gets burned without reducing grass production."

Several benefits also were found for burning in the fall or winter.

Grasses in areas burned in the winter or fall had more time to respond to precipitation, which reduced their susceptibility to mid-season drought. Burning in the fall and winter also resulted in a more diverse prairie with more cool-season grasses. These grasses are available earlier and are of a higher forage quality for cattle.

By burning when many animals are active, fires in the late spring can devastate wildlife. Snakes, turtles, prairie chickens and other nesting birds are less likely to be destroyed during fall and winter burns, as wildlife is often hibernating underground or have not yet built nests, Craine said.

Additionally, moving to a more

flexible burning schedule helps manage the large volume of smoke that carry to Manhattan and Wichita; Kansas City, Mo. Lincoln, Nebr., and other cities downwind. Burning over a wider time window would reduce the intensity of the smoke that carries to cities downwind and would be produced at times that are less likely to produce ground-level ozone.

"By burning earlier in the spring than what has been traditionally recommended, many of the smoke management issues in downwind cities can be alleviated," Towne said.

Researchers say that while there is always more research that needs to be conducted, there is no evidence that burning grasslands in the Flint Hills during fall and winter would have a negative effect on the prairies compared to late-spring burning.

"It looks like one of those rare situations where everybody wins," Craine said. "Our ranchers win. Our prairies win. And our neighbors downwind of the Flint Hills also win."

What to do about government failure

Whatever our political stripe, we all want government to fail less often. Citizens and the media need to press elected officials to spend more time digging into the nitty-gritty of fixing the bureaucracy.

As election season approaches, I’ve been pondering a crucial issue about the role of government in our society. It’s that our government often fails – and that we need to address this. What’s odd is that while the frequent failures in government’s performance are on ordinary people’s minds, politicians don’t talk much about fixing them.

True, you might hear a few words about the issue when members are back in their districts this month, revving up their re-election campaigns, but for the most part they’ll be focused on issues like jobs and the economy. This is understandable, because that’s what their constituents expect to hear about.

But it’s also a shame, because we need a healthy dialogue about why government fails and how to fix it. There’s ample cause for concern. The Veterans Affairs appointments scandal, the botched launch of the Affordable Care Act, duplicative programs to help low-income families, the 28 years of missed inspections that led to the explosion of the fertilizer plant in West, Texas, scandals at the General Services Administration and the Secret Service, a broken federal appointments process, the regulatory screwups that contributed to the Great Recession, bridge collapses and infrastructure failures....

There’s a long and dispiriting list of occasions when the federal government has fallen short. Yet the issues surrounding government performance don’t stir passion. As political scientist Paul C. Light has amply demonstrated, government failures happen for a lot of reasons that cannot be fixed easily, painlessly or quickly. Sometimes problems are rooted in policies that were ill-conceived, too complicated, or badly communicated. Sometimes the policies were fine, but the resources necessary to implement them were inadequate or misused.

There are organizational and institutional problems, poor oversight, poor leadership – no matter how good a policy, if good people aren’t available to carry it out, it will fail – and government’s alarming difficulty attracting and keeping highly qualified administrators. Often, leaders are bored by the nitty-gritty of management.

Still, these are challenges, not barriers. If our political leaders wanted to focus on improving government management and policy implementation, there’s no shortage of fixes they could make. They could:

- Ensure that federal agencies use pilot and trial programs much more frequently.
 - Require better and more rigorous evaluation and the use of metrics that lay bare what works and what doesn’t. There’s more attention being paid these days to efficacy, but still a trickle compared to what’s needed.
 - Avoid rushing to announce programs, strive to get it right rather than get it quickly, and pay as much attention to follow-through as the launch.
 - Devote more attention to how government will recruit, retain, and train the smart, highly qualified workers we need to carry out ever-more-complex programs. And reduce the number of political appointees in favor of filling most positions on the basis of ability.
- All of us want government to fail less often, so here’s my suggestion: As the General Election approaches, insist that your favored candidate work harder on making government more effective and efficient.

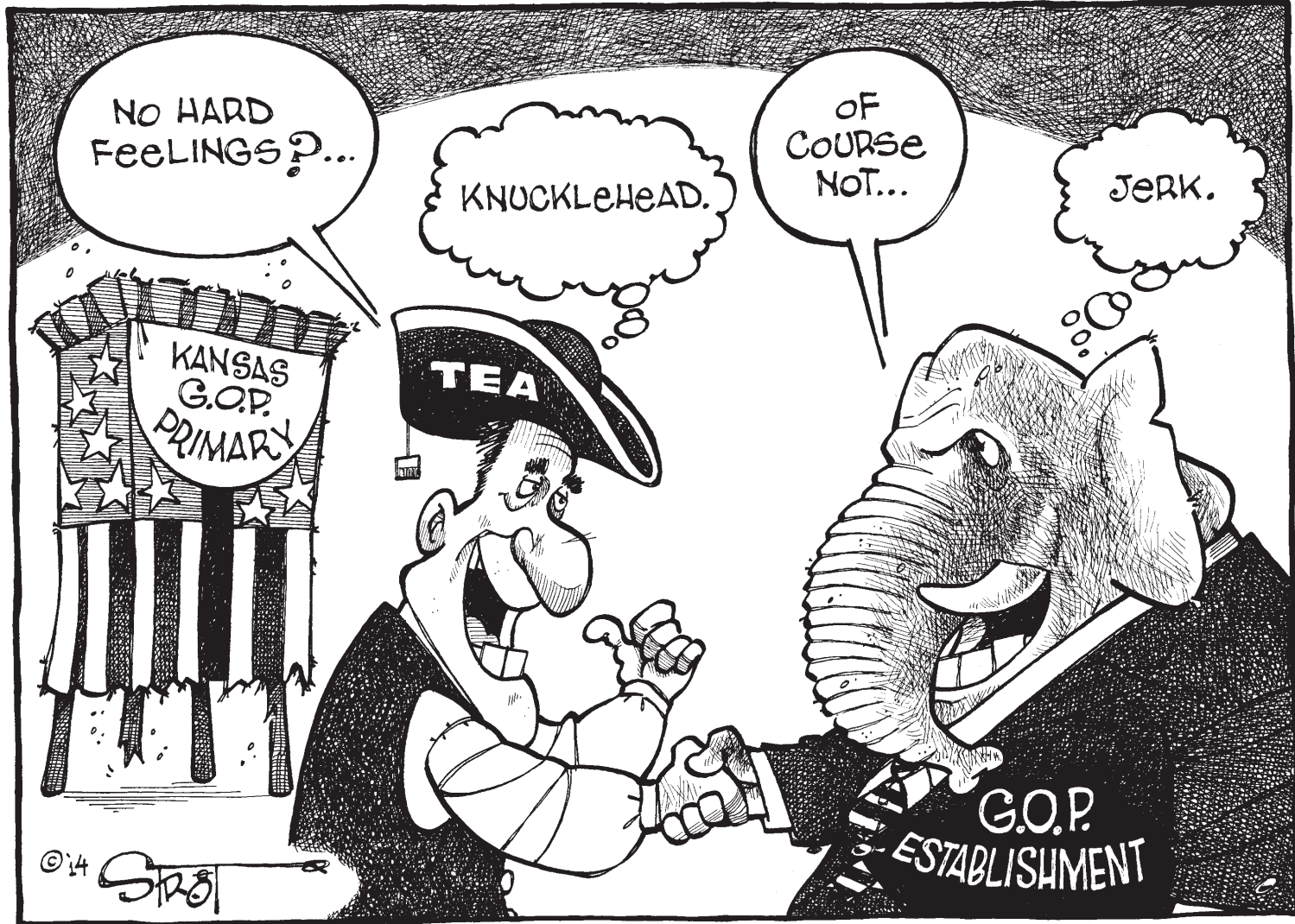

CIA involved in Kennedy assassination?

A new book, to be released Sept. 2, discloses a previously unknown connection between Presidents Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford, John F. Kennedy and the CIA. In fact, author Roger Stone, a former Nixon aide, asserts that Nixon “knew the CIA was involved in JFK’s assassination” and was so pesky in his attempts to get them to disclose all their records that the CIA contemplated the assassination of Nixon as well. The book, Nixon’s Secrets: The Rise, Fall, and Untold Truth about the President, Watergate, and the Pardon, demonstrates a definitely unfriendly relationship between himself and then CIA Director Richard Helms.

The plot to kill Nixon did not materialize, Stone alleges, because Nixon threatened to bring down everyone with what he knew of the Kennedy Assassination, including Gerald Ford, a member of the Warren Commission, who as a committee member “knew that the autopsy records had been altered. In 1996, declassified documents revealed indeed Gerry Ford changed the autopsy {report} with a pencil” and that’s why Ford gave Nixon “a full, free and unconditional pardon.” The book is full of blackmail and intrigue.

Roger Stone wrote that the CIA “felt JFK had stabbed them in the back refusing adequate support for the Bay of Pigs invasion {of Cuba}, which the agency had masterminded.” Moreover, he identified Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson as having “engineered” the assassination “aided by the CIA” (“The CIA Plotted to Assassinate Richard Nixon,” Economic Policy Journal, June 2, 2014).

CIA involvement in the Kennedy Assassination has always been one of the principle theories having much support. With so much newer material now available, fewer and fewer believe that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone. Especially was this so after 1989, when the West gained access to KGB records showing Oswald a poor marksman during his stay in the USSR a few months before he fired three shots upon the Kennedy limousine with such amazing accuracy.

The link to Johnson is also not a new theory.

More and more theorists have centered on Johnson for numerous reasons including his being the leading beneficiary of the death of his presidential predecessor and his immediately placing himself in charge of assembling the Warren Commission to investigate the assassination – even allegedly picking the individuals to serve thereon. Congress, with no vested interest in the outcome, should have formed the investigating committee. Johnson gained the most coveted office in the world. It is no secret that Kennedy planned to remove him from the ticket in the next election.

Renewed interest in the Johnson connection surfaced with the 1992 book, JFK: Conspiracy of Silence by Dr. Charles A. Crenshaw, one of the surgeons working on Oswald in Parkland Hospital. While doing so, he strangely received a phone call from President Johnson demanding that the physicians extract a death-bed confession from the accused assassin. Oswald died on the table without saying a word. Why is the new president obsessed with getting something on paper? The popular television documentary program 20/20 obtained White House logs of November 24, 1963 and determined that the call could have been made (“JFK Assassination Interview with Parkland Hospital Doctor Charles Crenshaw,” 20/20, Utube).

Only two governmental investigations of the assassination have occurred each ending with conflicting conclusions. The Executive Branch’s 1964 Warren Commission Report supported the single gunman theory. The House Select Committee on Assassinations in 1976, more than a decade later, concluded that Kennedy was, “probably assassinated as the result of a conspiracy. The committee is unable to identify the other gunman or the extent of

the conspiracy.”

Dr. Crenshaw, also the last to see Kennedy after helping to place him in his coffin, disclosed the shocking information that the hole in Kennedy’s neck, then the size of a little finger, demonstrated an entry wound, not an exit wound – that the wound had been tampered with to look like an exit wound. In other words, this shot came from the front. This supported the multiple assassin theory concluded by the House of Representatives. Amazingly neither the Warren Commission, nor the House Select Committee on Assassinations, interviewed Surgeon Dr. Crenshaw.

Complicating full disclosure even more, some 51 years later, is the government’s continued refusal to release “about 1,100 records – each record comprises 1-20 pages – that are considered to contain information about confidential sources or methods or have national security implications.” Most are referred to as the Joannides files. These “sit in metal boxes on shelves in ‘a big room that temperature – and humidity – controlled.’” These records are thought to show CIA involvement in the Kennedy Assassination as Joannides was a CIA agent “whose activities just before the assassination and, fascinatingly, during a government investigation years later, have tantalized researchers for years” (“Kennedy probe files still sealed 5 decades later,” Associated Press, Nov. 15, 2013).

So until these, mostly CIA, records are finally released, and the federal government is finally transparent, historians are forced to use what we can and Roger Stone’s book Nixon’s Secrets, reveals fresh involvement of the CIA and possibly President Johnson in the plot to kill President John F. Kennedy. For historians and assassination buffs this should be a great read. Meanwhile we need to force the government to release all the Kennedy files.

state in the spring of 2013. In the fall of 2013, the patrol partnered with the Kansas Center for Safe and Prepared Schools, the Kansas State Juvenile Officers Association, and the Kansas Division of Emergency Management to provide a series of active shooter tabletop exercises across the state. Educators and law enforcement personnel were invited to attend these training sessions. The exercises focused on a school active shooter event to increase awareness

and reinforce the need for implementing and exercising a local plan. These training initiatives were well attended and well received. In November 2013, an executive summary was prepared and delivered to Governor Brownback regarding those efforts.

As a result of the various training interactions, and in preparation for the coming school year, the KHP has developed a Kansas-based active shooter training initiative titled Kansas Active Shooter Mitigation. This training initiative was developed to

provide critical information in a timely manner to educators and administrators on what to expect in the event of an active shooter, as well as potential options and considerations to mitigate that threat. This training program will be taught by designated Highway Patrol personnel.

In 2015, it is planned to offer a train-the-trainer program for designated Kansas law enforcement officers to attend and receive a training certification enabling them to teach the active shooter course in their local community. Additionally, this training course

is modular and will be adaptable to address active shooter awareness and mitigation in the workplace.

"Our primary goal was to provide a state-wide resource to facilitate active shooter awareness training and to encourage crisis planning between educators and law enforcement at the local level. There are many ideas and programs being offered across the country. A lot of the concepts are similar and based on a variety of incidents and experiences. We felt it was important to have a Kansas solution that addressed the feedback

we received interacting with Kansas educators and law enforcement, incorporating what we see as the current best practices. It's important to us that this training be offered at no cost to reach as many educators as possible. We want to help our educators explore various options in their planning and response to this tragic phenomenon," said Major Jason De Vore, special operations commander for the patrol.

Roofers register under new regulation

More than 1,000 roofing contractors registered to do business in Kansas in the first 14 months of the new Roofing Contractor Registration Act, Kansas Attorney General Derek Schmidt said today.

The attorney general's office issued its 1,000th roofing registration certificate last week. Some roofers that initially registered have failed to renew their registration as required by law; consequently, while more than 1,000 registrations have been approved, the number of actively registered roofers who may lawfully do business in Kansas now stands at 926.

"When considering roofing work on a home or business, it is important that consumers make sure their roofing contractor is properly registered before signing any contract or having any work done," Schmidt said. "Consumers should request a copy of their roofer's registration certificate and then should check our consumer protection website to confirm that the registration remains active."

The requirement to register with the attorney general's office is in addition to any other local requirements that may be imposed by cities or counties. The online directory of registrations is available at www.InYourCornerKansas.org.

The Kansas Roofing Contractor Registration Act was passed during the 2013 legislative session and took effect July 1, 2013. With few exceptions, the law requires roofing contractors to obtain a registration certificate from the Kansas Attorney General in order to legally provide commercial or residential roofing services for a fee in Kansas. It is designed to ensure that legitimate roofing contractors are complying with state requirements, such as carrying appropriate insurance, and to help prevent fly-by-night operators from taking advantage of Kansas consumers.

Any Kansans who have problems with roofing contractors may file a request for the attorney general's Consumer Protection Division to investigate at (800) 432-2310 or www.InYourCornerKansas.org. The attorney general requests that Kansans promptly report any unregistered person or company attempting to sell roofing services.

K-State scientist has tips to reduce food risk

After eating a meal at a new or one of your favorite restaurants, you immediately don't feel well. Flu-like symptoms ensue, and understandably, you're more worried about your achy tummy than calling the restaurant and local health department to report what could be a case of food borne illness.

Karen Blakeslee, food scientist for Kansas State Research and Extension and coordinator of the Rapid Response Center, said many times people who contract a food borne illness don't know who or where to go to report their experience. A new study, however, has shown that a social media app is making it easier to track down food borne illness occurrences.

During a nine-month period, software programs screened about 294,000 reviews of New York City restaurants on business review site Yelp.com for possible cases of food borne illness from July 2012 to March 2013. The software flagged 893 reviews for evaluation by an epidemiologist, which resulted in the identification of 468 reviews consistent with recent or potentially recent food borne illness.

However, only three percent of the reviews described events that had been reported to health agencies, such as the health department, hospital or doctor. The results of

this pilot project, a collaborative venture among the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, Columbia University and Yelp, suggested online restaurant reviews might help identify unreported outbreaks of food borne illness and restaurants with poor food handling practices.

If you get sick from food, whether from food prepared at home, a church supper or a restaurant, you should report it, she said. Many times, you are not the only person feeling ill. It takes two or more people to declare a foodborne illness outbreak.

For many healthy people, food borne illness will go away within 24 hours. But those who are young, elderly and are immune-compromised can get severely ill.

Food borne illness could be hard to pinpoint. Symptoms can start within a few hours after eating, or it could take days. Common symptoms include nausea, diarrhea and vomiting, Blakeslee said. Sometimes a fever, chills and a headache also occur. Other challenges include identifying the problem food, and where and when the food was consumed.

Washing your hands before eating is the best way to protect yourself from foodborne illness, Blakeslee said.

Consumers should know that the food itself is sometimes not the culprit, Blakeslee said. The environment could also contribute

to food borne illness. Norovirus, for example, spreads rapidly from person-to-person contact.

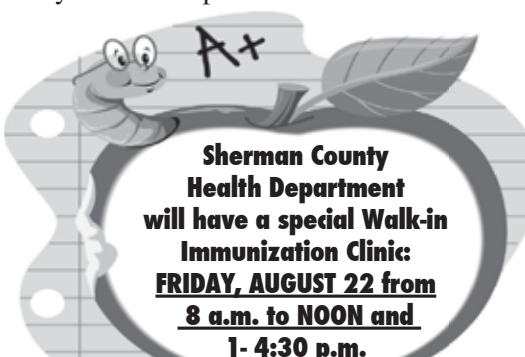


ASBESTOS ISSUE IN USD 352

Asbestos is an issue USD 352 has been dealing with for several years. The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act of 1986 was enacted by Congress. This Act determines the extent of and develops solutions for any problems schools may have with asbestos. USD 352 has had their facilities inspected by a certified asbestos inspector. The inspector located, sampled and rated the condition and hazard potential of material and lab analysis records were turned over to a certified management planner to develop asbestos management plans. A copy of the asbestos management plan is available for your inspection in USD 352's Administration offices during regular business hours. Kenny Studer is the asbestos coordinator of USD 352. All inquiries regarding the plan should be directed to him. Contact Kenny at (785) 890-2397. USD 352 is implementing the asbestos management plan. It is the District's intent to comply with federal, state and local regulations. USD 352 plans on taking whatever steps are necessary to insure your child and the District's employees have a healthy and safe environment in which to learn and work.

AUTOMATED CALLING SYSTEM:

USD 352 has an automated calling system for rapid notification purposes. Be sure the school has your current phone number.



IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS:

* Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis (DTaP): five doses required. Four doses acceptable if dose 4 given on or after the 4th birthday. A single dose of Tdap required at grades 7-12 if no previous history of Tdap vaccination regardless of interval since the last Td vaccine.

* Poliomyelitis (IPV/OPV): four doses required. Three doses acceptable. One dose required after age 4 regardless of the number of previous doses, with a 6 month minimum interval from the previous dose.

* Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR): two doses required.

* Hepatitis B: three doses required through grade 12.

* Varicella (chickenpox): two doses required for K-4 and 7-9 grades; one dose required grades 5-6 and 10-12 unless history of varicella disease documented by a licensed physician. Two doses are currently recommended by the ACIP for all ages.

* Haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib): four doses required for children less than age 5 in early childhood programs. Total doses needed for series completion is dependent on the type of vaccine and the age of the child when doses given.

* Pneumococcal conjugate (PVC): four doses required for children less than age 5 in early childhood programs. Total doses needed dependent on the age of the child when doses given.

* Hepatitis A: two doses required for children less than age 5 in early childhood programs. The first dose is given at 12-18 months of age, with a 6 month interval between the first and second dose.

ACIP RECOMMENDED IMMUNIZATIONS (NOT REQUIRED FOR SCHOOL ENTRY)

*** Meningococcal (MCV4): one dose recommended at 11 years of age with a booster dose at 16 years.

*** Human Papillomavirus (HPV): three doses recommended for males and females at 11 years of age.

*** Influenza: yearly vaccinations recommended for all ages 6 months or older.

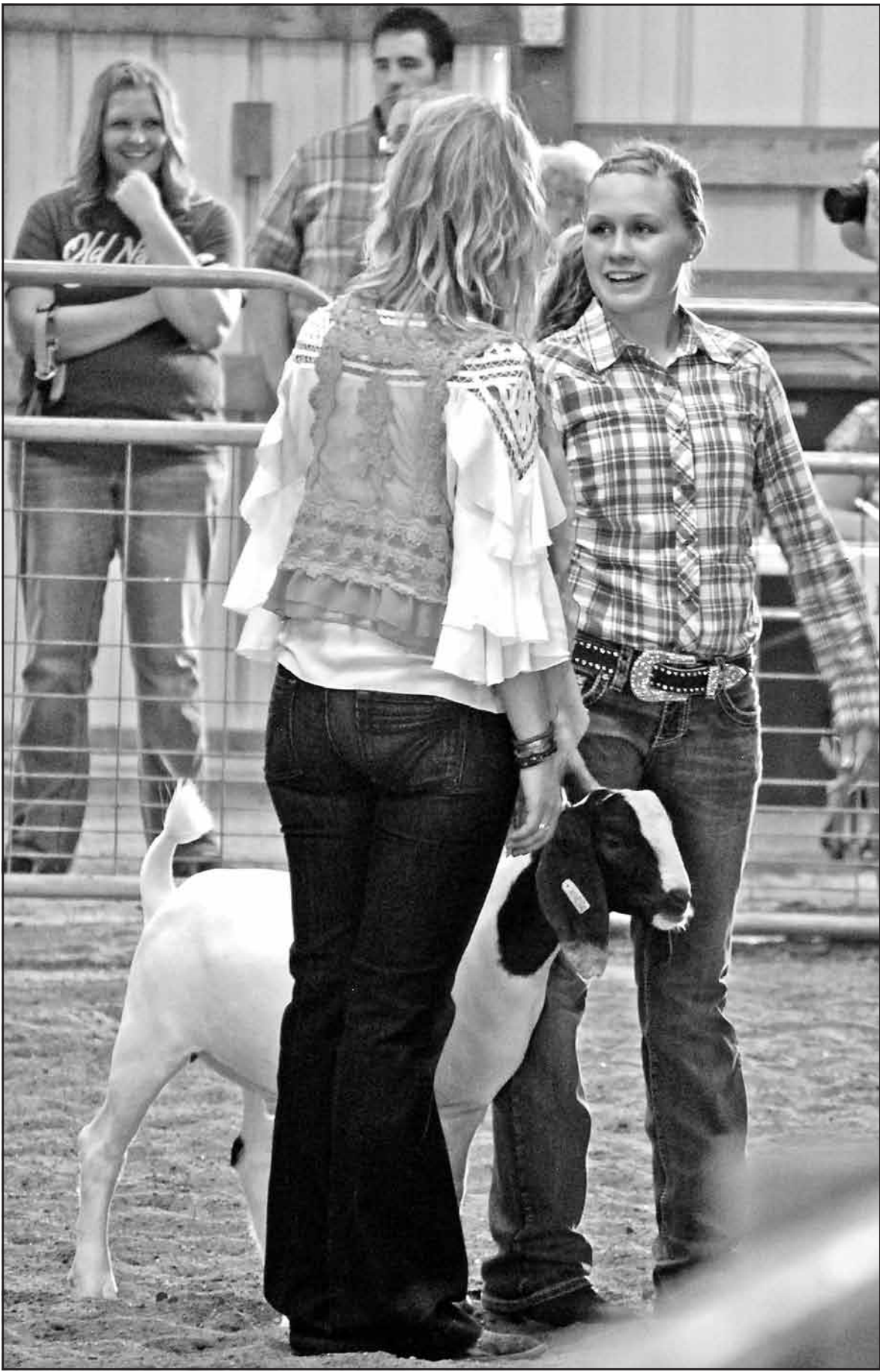

Touring Pro Division standings with 1,402 total points ahead of Triplett, 1,380, and Blanco, 1,353. Stetson Lawrence is running in first place with 2,058, and Lee in second with 2,032.

The next event for the Touring Pro riders is the Baton Rouge Chris Shivers Invitational on Friday and Saturday. The season continues until the final event in San Antonio, Texas, on Dec. 20.

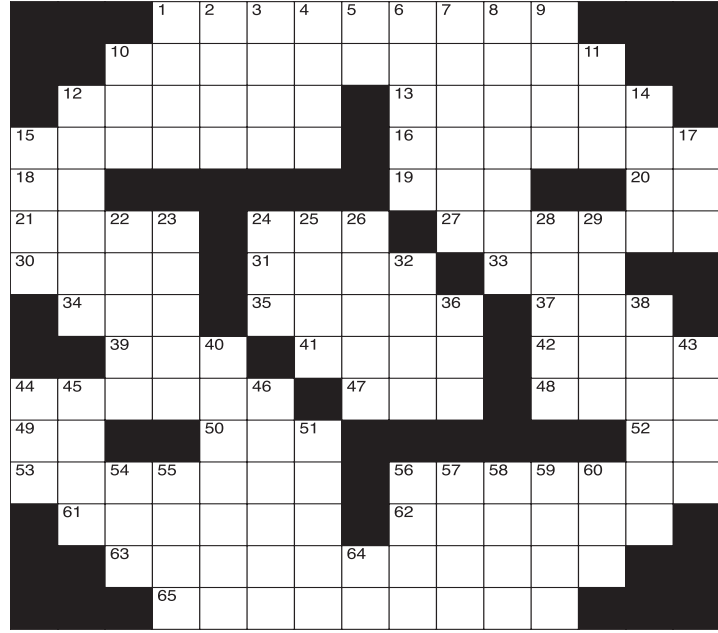
