Vernon "Ray" Huffman, 82, St. Francis, a retired high school teacher and coach, died Saturday, March 26, 2005, at the Cheyenne County Hospital.

He and his surviving twin sister, Irma Faye (Cliff) Campbell of rural Beloit, were born Sept. 24, 1922, near Ashville, the children of Stella (Critchfield) and Walter Garland He attended rural schools and

In 1947, he married Rachel Oshant of Hays and began his coaching and teaching career. He was a teacher and coach in Scott City, Palco, Jetmore, Kingman and St. Francis for 39 years. He earned a master's degree plus additional hours in counseling during these

Summer trips to Beloit for wheat harvest at his sister's meant her homemade bread and pies, her husband's homemade ice cream, meals in the fields and fun with nephews and nieces. Other summers were spent managing the St. Francis swimming pool with helpers from Hays while getting ready

Huffman was a 45-year member of Lions International and was a member of several educational and coaching associations and the St.

Francis United Methodist Church. He retired in 1989 and enjoyed traveling, especially fishing and camping in the Southwest. He enjoyed golfing, but attending school

events was uppermost. Preceding him in death were his parents; a sister, Beulah Chapman of Lamar, Colo.; and two brothers, Loren Huffman of Chicago and Ralph Huffman of Hays.

Besides his twin and her husband, his wife also survives.

Memorial services were planned for today, Friday, April 1, 2005, at the church with the Rev. Morita Truman officiating. Inurnment will be later in Hays.


